I am setting up an aquarium for the first time. This is no big problem, but what is your opinion on the usage of live plants in the tank as opposed to plastic plants. I would prefer a natural setting for the fish and yet I have heard various negative points to the contrary. What do you think?


Dear S.A.,

According to authorities, the necessity of live plants to maintain an oxygen-carbon dioxide balance in an aguarium is myth. Granted, given adequate light, plants take up carbon dioxide which is produced by the fish and give off oxygen as a by-product which in solution fish use.

While all of this is true, the presence of green plants in an aquarium does not materially increase the fish-carrying capacity of an aquarium, nor does the presence of fish substantially affect the plant growth. In other words, each would do about as well without the other, though the plants benefit more from the fish than vica-versa. Besides live plants can be a hassle if they are harboring a bacteria detrimental to fish. So plastic plants when arranged properly can be quite beautiful and there is no problem with care.

A prestigious newspaper ad caught my attention recently while scanning the movie section. The film was called The Ark of Noah and was written, produced and directed by one Burt Larue, which tipped me off right away that this was probably a documentary, as no one can do all that with major theatrical films produced today.

I assume you have heard of the Ark, and in case you haven't, the producer (writer, etc.) uses up the first four of seven reels of his film to refresh your memory. In those reels, the ark is portraved by a Premium Saltine box in Ark drag, shot real close so it looks big. The film tells of an endless number of adventures by brave men who have scaled a mountain on the border of Turkey and Russia where it is said the Ark came to rest. After a long wait, he bribed absolutely everyone in order to get up to the top of the mountain to the You-Know-What.


Once up there, he was unable to locate the Ark due to bad weather and lots of snow. So as the film drew to an agonizing close, the Ark remained safely tucked away in the snow and cold (to keep better, I suppose).

I had so hoped that after all the boredom of the beginning of this home movie, that the editor would have decided there were more creative ways to use his talents and show the Ark dropped into Lucite and sold in little boutiques everywhere as paper weights.

I wish the advertising campaign hadn't been so uppity. There should have been tacky spots on television saying, "You've read the book — now see the film!" That would have lured more people to the film — but I wouldn't have been one of them. As it was, people were leaving the theater in droves.
