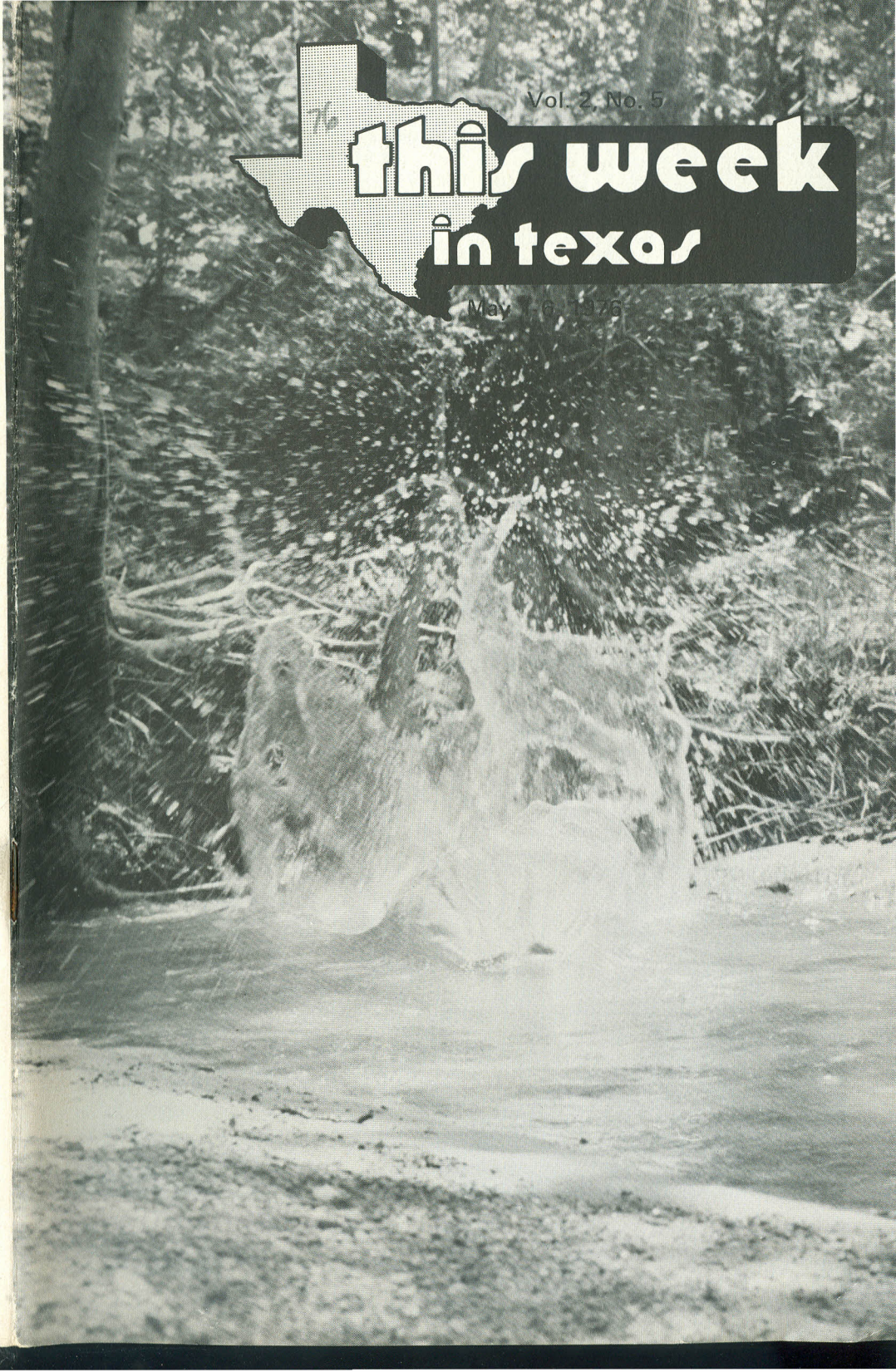

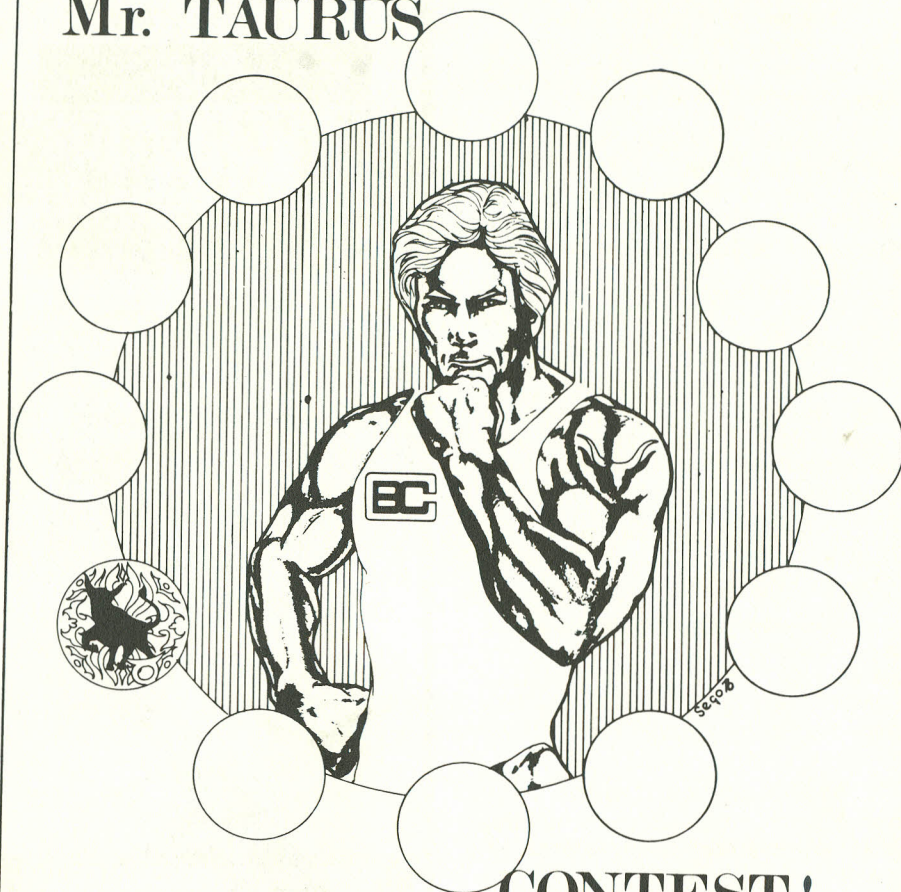

That exotic "feel" of summer is beginning to cast its special spell over all and the bathing suit social season is revving up for a massive show of strength. But first (and this is REALLY important, so just "cool" it for a minute), there's one major matter to be taken care of. In Houston.

Representative to the state legislature, from the Montrose district, Ron Waters comes up for re-election on Saturday. As you know, Ron is the only state legislator to call for the repeal of state sodomy laws that result in the continued arrests of persons for "victimless" crimes. Many of his colleagues say they agree with Ron, but just can't bear the thought of voting for such measures because of their conservative constituents. Ron's other colleagues just laugh at him. Many are watching Ron's re-election bid to see just how important an issue this may be. Saturday, as I said, is voting day. The same day as Splash Day. But please, for goodness sake, vote for Ron Waters before you head out for Galveston. Remember, Ron only won re-election last time by 300 votes. So EVERY VOTE will count Saturday. And could count for a lot. If the one pro-gay spokesman in the legislature goes down to defeat, I don't have to tell you what the other lawmakers will take as a license to do. The Ron Waters race will affect you directly, especially if you are aware of the anti-gay beliefs of his opponent. To vote for Ron means you'll have to vote Democratic, of course. But then this race, which affects your daily life, is probably, at this stage of the game, a lot more important than any popularity race endorsement of Ronald Reagan, which requires Republican voting and therefore inactivates your

support of Ron. Also, please note the Gay Political Caucus endorsements elsewhere in this issue.

Speaking of that organization, we remind you that Bruce Voeller, Executive Director of the National Gay Task Force, will be featured speaker at the regular GPC meeting on May 5th at the MCCR at 7:30pm. A very special evening not to be missed. Incidentally, the GPC summer schedule of meetings calls for sessions on the first Wednesday of each month in May, June, July and August. Upcoming is the naming of members who will be part of the National Gay Pride Week Coalition committee. Also, an exact date for that event will be announced.

The University of Houston has announced that a gay studies course will be offered this summer to anyone caring to join, as part of their Sundry School Program. The title of the course is "Being Gay and Relating to Gays." The course is open to both gays and non-gays and will be offered for eight weeks, with classes from 7 to 9p.m. You must register by June 14th. The course will also be offered again next semester. For further info, call the U. of H.

And in the "Get This" department, Houston now has two new motorcycle clubs. Both clubs will call the Filling Station their home bar. The International Road Masters Texas Chapter requires that you have a motorcycle to join. The other new club, however, the American Leathermen, requires only that you have a knack for things S&M. (Guess your choice of club boils down to just "what" you prefer to "ride.") Anyway, the Bayou City welcomes them both — and by the way, we send special second anniversary greetings to the Houston Motorcycle

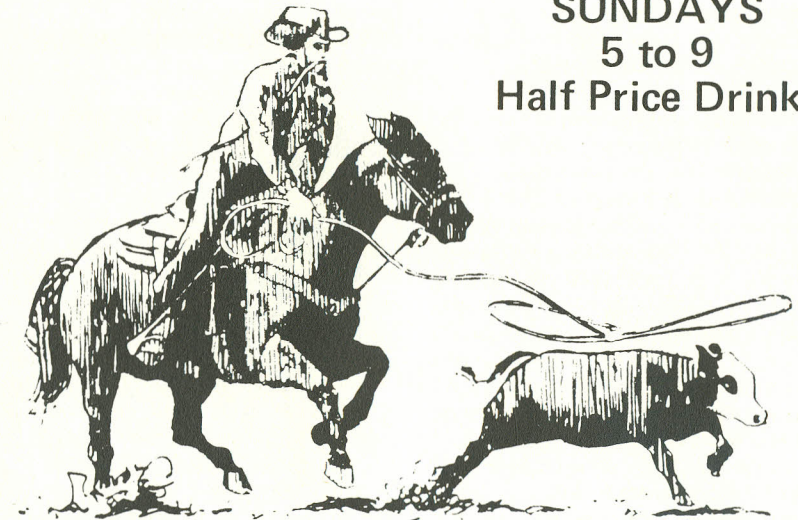

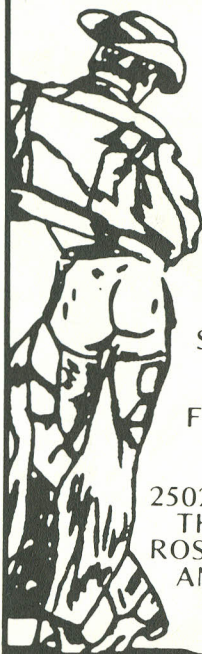
Maybe ya'll should check into Amazon Studios in San Antonio for a good massage. It's the only place there to get one. Ya'll have really earned it.

P.S. — It looks like that whole thing about the extra body is going to blow over. Haven't read anything in the papers, lately, but will wait and see.

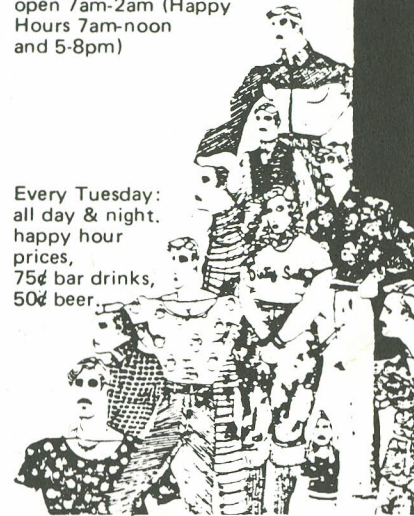

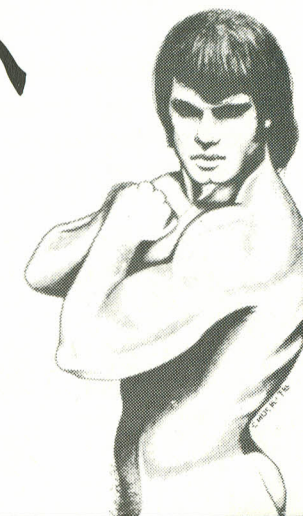

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Gay News Briefs

PRESIDENT FORD RESPONDS TO GAY RIGHTS QUESTION DURING CAMPAIGN

It finally happened. President Ford was asked about gay rights during one of his campaign appearances. And, if you can believe it, he said even less than he has on other issues of the day. The response is reported from Peoria, Illinois, to have gone like this:

"Civil rights for what?" Pause. "I recognize that this is a very new and serious problem in America. I always try to be an understanding person as far as people are concerned who are different than myself. I think this is a problem we have to face up to and I can't give you a pat answer. I just would be dishonest to say there is a pat answer."

Granted, this is the first time the President has been faced in public with the question. Probably it should be taken as important that he wasn't antagonistic. Perhaps what he needs is a good briefing with background information. Maybe he should ask son Jack, who has recently been out in at least one of the "mixed" bars in New York City.

SIGNS APPEARING THAT CATHOLIC CHURCH ANTI-GAY POLICY MAY BE WEAKENING

Several current clues are emerging to suggest that the anti-gay theological position of the Catholic church is beginning to weaken. The clues may often be contradictory, but they are beginning to turn up with increasing frequency.

At a meeting of American Bishops last fall, Texas Bishop Warren Boudreaux may have summed up current thinking in this country when he was reported by Newsweek's March 8th issue to have said, "To listen is not necessarily to approve, to report is not necessarily to endorse, to study is not necessarily to change, but not to consult is to fail."

This accomodating view was somewhat superceded last month by a Vatican declaration that "homosexuals, though sinners, should be treated with compassion." It's hard to be sure exactly how to interpret the declaration. Brooklyn Bishop Francis J. Mugavero issued a pastoral letter to his congregations stating that gays have "legitimate" rights like everyone else. He urged members of his diocese to "explore ways to secure the legitimate rights of all our citizens regardless of sexual orientation." He has also suggested that the Vatican declaration was too severe in tone "like the last six

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commandments, with lots of 'thou shalt nots.'"

No immediate change in church doctrine is foreseen. However, the general softening of position may be an important sign of success of Dignity, the national Catholic organization concerned with rights for gays. Beyond its general work, Dignity has enjoyed particular success in the scheduling of special masses for gays in Boston, Chicago and San Francisco. Father John McNeill, founder of the New York Dignity chapter, plans to publish a book advancing the theme of gay being O.K. The most significant circumstance surrounding the book may lie in the fact that he was received permission to publish it from his Jesuit superior. The church only rarely permits publication of a philosophy in contradiction to current church doctrine. Is that another clue?

**WASHINGTON, D.C., SURVEY
DISCOVERS THAT
ATTITUDES ARE CHANGING**

Sixty-three percent of the people polled in Washington, D.C., have stated that they favor decriminalization of homosexuality among consenting adults. These results come from a major survey conducted by the Bureau of Social Research (which should be free of any bias), according to the Washington Post.

The least support for decriminalization came from older people, poorly educated people and lower income blacks, although in each group a majority still agreed. Present laws in the District of Columbia are similar to those in 36 states with outlaw oral and anal intercourse.

A similar study conducted in 1973

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showed that only 58% of the residents favored decriminalization. Washington gay rights spokesman Dr. Frank Kameny said that "In the last ten years or so something has gone on in terms of a change of attitude in general. There has been a heightened sensitivity in recent years to questions of privacy and personal freedom in several ways. As far as consenting adults acting in private, the number of arrests is literally zero in the country as a whole."

The exact tabulations of the survey were: 63% agree, 27% disagree and 10% don't know.

"I say that if a heterosexual had been raised to believe that his preference for the opposite sex was 'sick,' twisted, abominable, sinful and a disgrace to his family, he would ask for help on how to 'straighten himself out,' too.

"Homosexuality is a problem because an unenlightened society has made it a problem, but I have received letters by the thousands (not just 'ocasionally') from gay people telling me they wouldn't be straight if they had a choice. All they ask is to be loved in their way without facing the charge that they are 'sick and twisted.' I say love and let love."

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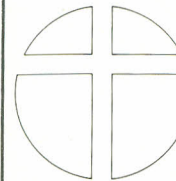
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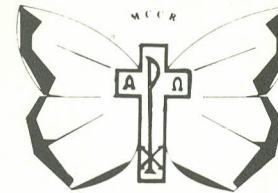
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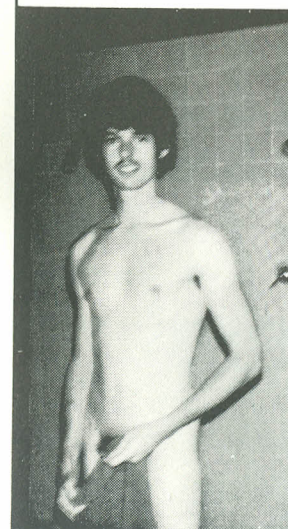
