
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


"are." bars that "aren't." and bars that "hope to be."

And that's about it for now. Have a great holiday! See ya after it's all over. (Maybe we can get together and share hangovers.) All for now.





"He was not! And the conversation is closed. I don't want to talk about it any more. In fact, I don't think I ever want to talk to you again."


"You sure know how to be cruel, don't you? Why don't you show me a little sympathy. My feet are covered with blisters and all you can do is insult me."


"It's your own damn fault. I told you it wasn't proper to wear high heels to Disneyland."


"I'm going to to soak in a hot tub," Vera stated, heading toward the bathroom.
