



In the continuing, and increasingly heated, softball competition, the Loft defeated the Lamp Post 19 to 12 last Sunday. If you haven't been going to the games,








And finally in Fort Worth, Alice Fallas and April Love have joined Jackie George at Aub's. Just how much hotter can things get over there?


The disco version of "Dancing Free" by Hot Ice is just starting to happen in the area.

"Henry who?"


"I can't remember the last name. He's on some TV show. Some show for kids. I've never seen it."


"I'm all for that. If it'll get me out of this blind date. Just ten minutes!


"They're going to be here in just ten minutes. I feel sick." Burt uttered, with growing resignation.
