
Sampling Texas



A lot of bar news makes its way from San Antonio this week, not





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

Dear Little,



What are the kinds of laws that often get gay people arrested for sexual activities in public places? John R., Dallas, Texas


Dear John,

Short and simple, there are three classes of statutes under which gay people are arrested for activities in public: sodomy statutes; statutes prohibiting solicitation for illegal sexual conduct; and loitering or disorderly conduct statutes. Sexual conduct in public, whether between gays or straights, is illegal. While straights who are apprehended engaging in sexual activity in public will often be charged with disorderly conduct or lewd behavior, and many frequently escape with just a warning, gays are more likely to be charged with the sodomy statutes, in addition to the disorderly conduct charge.

Gay News Briefs

TEXAS GAY CONFERENCE III

Activists from as far away as Pensacola, Florida, were attracted to the University of Houston campus for the third annual Texas Gay Conference, June 18-20. In its first appearance in Houston, the perennial event was keynoted by Jean O'Leary, Executive Co-Director of the National Gay Task Force, and Vito Russo, New York writer and film critic. The conference was jointly sponsored by the Texas Gay Task Force and the Gay Academic Union.

O'Leary, a PhD candidate, is also the first publicly identified homosexual to be elected a delegate to the 1976 Democrat National Convention. She represents Bella Abzug's Greenwich Village Congressional District. Having spent most of the previous month lobbying in Washington, D.C., she presented a discouraging picture for gay rights in the 1976 presidential campaign. Although considerable support was mustered in the Democrat Platform Committee, including the Texas member of the Draft Committee. the planks supporting decriminalization of consensual adult homosexual acts and the extension of civil rights protections to gay

people became casualities of the Jimmy Carter forces. O'Leary emphasized that these planks were not defeated because they pertained to homosexuals, per se, but because they are controversial and Carter wants a low key campaign. Planks strongly supporting women's rights and abortion were also casualties. She professed ambivalence about Carter himself. She has a long list of seemingly pro-gay quotes by Carter, but all contain escape clauses. For example, he has stated that laws should not be applied unequally to gays, but has also said that homosexual acts constitute fornication and should be penalized as such. He has pledged himself as president to sign the National Gay Rights Bill, fully aware of the unlikelihood of its passing Congress soon. Although O'Leary feels the Democrats have shortchanged gay citizens, she feels a Democrat victory in November at least holds some promise in the turnover of 20,000 appointive federal posts. She believes our best hope is to continue to generate grassroots momentum by enacting local and state legislation.

A conference highlight was Vito Russo's ninety minute film of


clips from movies since 1932 illustrating the portraval of gav people. Russo said there is sufficient material available to produce a 21/2 day anthology, so he has limited his presentation to about a dozen productions including "Tea and Sympathy," "The Killing of Sister George," "The Boys In The Band," "Victim," and "The Children's Hour." As excerpts, they are a strong indictment of the fictionalization of homosexuals as either laughable cariactures or pathetic, guiltridden subhumans. A sequence of suicide scenes left the audience stunned. Mercifully, this was relieved by a few upbeat clips including Bugs Bunny in Carmen Miranda drag. Russo hopes to refine his presentation into a Public Broadcasting System documentary.


The Texas Gay Task Force presented State Representative Craig Washington with a resolution proclaiming his Outstanding Legislator Of The Year for his efforts to repeal the state sodomy statute. In an eloquent and moving acceptance speech, Washington said that "effort is its own reward" and mentioned that several legislators who have voted against repeal privately support it.


The conference concluded with a Sunday afternoon Gay Pride Parade organized by the Gay Activists Alliance. About 300 persons participated in the march down Main and Fannin streets.

Next year's conference will be held in Austin.

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


Life With Vera a serial by John Gardner
