





A big slate of doin's is also on tap at the Depository, including a special buffet and the giving away of many, many very lavish door prizes.



Word has it that the party for Fred at the Spanish Harlem was a resounding success, with more than 400 people in attendance.



"I don't believe it! Remember the Alamo?" Burt probed increduously.


"It could be worse. At least he didn't ask for the Gettysburg Address!"
