"No. He didn't even take his own stuff."


"What are you going to do with his things, have a garage sale?"

"Well, I didn't really give him the opportunity to acquire a lot of material possessions," Phoebe added. "We'd only lived together since Wednesday."





It looks like two different people."

"The illusion," Russell admits, "is all that matters. Most impersonators never try to hide the fact that they're men. I've seen the reactions of audiences watching a woman do impersonations. They don't get off to a woman.

A man tries to compliment a woman. A man can build his hips up, but a woman can't take away the hips."

And the hardest part?

"The hardest part is rehearsing. Figuring out a new show. Most performers design and make their own gowns."

Any pet peeves?

"Just one. People who will walk up on stage in the middle of a performance and disrupt a carefully rehearsed comedy sketch to tip you a dollar. That makes me mad."

Some people consider Russell outspoken and brash. Others will defend him to the core, while frankly admitting to his "painful honesty." All in all, he's an excellent entertainer, and one to be reckoned with.



REVIEWS

WOODY ALLEN

Woody Allen movies never seem to die. They keep cropping up from time to time to haunt Texas film-goers and then mysteriously reappear in neighborhood moviehouses that run them perversely (even religiously) throughout the year. And some of them can be funny. Hysterical, as a matter of fact.

But most of this humor lies in the undeveloped potential; the sight gags so carefully contrived, the jokes so carefully set up and delivered that one begins to laugh, not at the puns themselves, but at their sheer contrivance. As in **Sleeper**, where a mechanical dog shits tiny transistors. Or **Everything You Always Wanted To Know About Sex**, where a runaway monster-tit is trapped in a 50 foot bra. Ha. Ha. Okay, maybe it doesn't bring you to the floor in hysterics. But seeing these

dissimilar ends brought about by such complex and intricate methods is indeed very funny. Take it from us. To be able to see past the silliness and into the methods behind it is definitely a unique entertainment experience. Allen tries so hard.

A scene in Play It Again Sam has Warhol's Viva admitting to her nymphomania while refusing Allen's hot and heavy advances. She tells him of her uncensored desire to be taken, ravaged, and used. And Allen, loser as always, is unable to arrouse this blatant passion. In another scene, he even fails to make points with an underground movie star whose last film had her being gang-banged in a locker room epic.

A lot of Allen's humor is in self embarrassment. He embarrasses himself on the screen, then embarrasses the audience vicariously. We hold our breaths during Sex as he gets his hand caught in Vanessa Redgrave's chastity belt during a medieval segment. And in Bananas, when he tries to inconspicuously purchase a porno magazine while under the scrutiny of a disarming old woman, only to have the clerk at the register holler out, "Hey! Phil! How much for this copy of Orgasm!?"

It's as if Allen is saying, "Look at me. I'm embarrassed. Remember the last time you were?"

Many people won't sit through a Woody Allen movie. They consider his humor unsophisticated and demeaning. And granted, his earlier attempts were little short of ridiculous. But lately we have noticed a definite style developing. A flair. Love and Death is literally jam-packed with take offs on existentialist humor. But he's not above lines like: "We're here to see Napolean. I brought my flats." Or slapstick evolving around a foiled assasination attempt.

His messages are usually fatalistic. His pacing is sophomoric and unsteady. But the potential is there. And we find ourselves laughing right along with it.




