
REGISTER - VOTE!


As election time draws closer, all eligible gay persons in Texas should become registered to vote before the October 1 deadline. At all levels, the numbers of gay people involved in the political process is increasing, including initiating voter registration drives within the bars and questioning the candidates' position on gay rights, then making this information known within the gay communities. Utilizing our voting right can be an effective means by which elected officials know that there is a large gay voter bloc and that, as part of their constituency, we intend to hold them accountable to us. An important first step is to become registered. If you are not registered to vote, then obtain a voter registration card - they're prominently displayed in many gay businesses - and fill it out and mail to your tax accessor col-

lector by October 1. For more information concerning House and Senate races in the Texas legislature in your area, contact Texas Gay Task Force, Box 2036, Universal City, Tx 78148.

TEXAS A&M ALTERNATIVE




The Habitat's first broadway show will be "Hello Dolly", starring Trixie as the Jewish Madam. Watch for the opening date.

WESTERN BAND AT THE NEW LOFT


This is definitely the weekend to



The Old Plantation rates a big gold star for the possessing show, and we hope to see more of its caliber in the near future.





We have some special guests arriving and ...") Four dignitaries from the Mexican Government suddenly waltzed into the council chamber and the photographers went wild. A display of strobes that rivaled the Depository's light show.

It was Wednesday morning. TWIT accompanied Ray Hill to the Mayor's weekly "Citizen Gripe Session" and waited patiently through several humdrum speeches between Hofheinz and Company before the business of the

day actually began.

Hill was coming before City Council to speak out against Officer John Freeman's recent lumping of homosexuals and child molestors in a slanderous speech he made before PTA officials at the HISD administration building. Hill's name was finally called and a few knowing grins broke out on the faces of Councilman Mann and Westmoreland while the rest of our "city fathers" assumed an embarrassed look. The speech he delivered was very good — not quite so self-involving as some of his others; but apathy was at an all time high. And the Mayor was his usual attentive self. He spent Hill's three minutes talking on the phone.

A Soaper by John Gardner



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



YOU MAY BE DISEASED

Don't look now - or maybe you should — but a new type of venereal epidemic is spreading through the gay community. It's Herpes Simplex II - aviral infection somewhat similar to the one that causes cold sores or fever blisters. Except it's highly contagious. It's most common manifestation is as a rash of clear blisters in the genital or rectal areas. As long as these blisters are present, the herpes virus can be transmitted to any tissue which comes into contact with the liquid inside the blisters. So if you have the blisters on one area of your body, you can easily infect other areas of your body. If the blisters are in your genital, rectal, or oral areas, you can easily infect a sex partner. As long as the blisters are present, the disease is infectious.

But here's the catch. There is symptomatic relief but no known cure for the disease. This means that once you've got it, you've got it for life even though the blisters will go away. They could come back at any time. Some drugs are being tried in Europe, and they seem to be working effectively against the cause of the infection. However, the U.S. FDA has not okayed the use of any of these treatments in the States. In order to get approval for the use of any of these drugs, their effects must be studied for a period of up to two years under approved FDA programs. The Montrose Activities Center is currently cooperating with several drug companies and a major Houston research clinic to undertake such a study. Aside from being a financial success. Flesh Gordon brought a new dimension of soft core pornography to the screen. In its sleaziness, it managed to draw laughs from the crudest of iokes and the trashiest of sight gags. And it was all in fun.

But then the producers of Flesh decided to try their hand at another adult fantasy with the creation of an x-rated version of Lewis Carroll's classic Alice In Wonderland. They even tried to make it into a musical and this is where they failed. Not that the film was handled differently from Flesh, or that the tunes weren't catchy. But pornography and musical comedy just don't mix. It's like egg nog and divinity. They're both such strong mediums that it's virtually impossible for them to keep from cancelling each other

Had producer/director William Osco allowed the bizarre musical to remain on a light, campy strain, the film just might have worked. But he didn't. He tried to make Alice look artsy with too many slow motion, weird angle shots. He tried to give it class by throwing in some alarmingly clever songs coupled with some rather stylish dances (choreographed by a Los Angeles dance studio. Well, when you're on a tight budget . . .) But worst of all, he tried to make the movie say something. He tried to give it an anti-moralistic message.

It seems that Alice (Christene Debell) is no longer a little girl but a budding young innocent who can't bring herself to make it with her boyfriend. At the beginning of the film she sings a Streisand-ish song (something about little-girl-growing-up) before the appearance of lecherous Mr. Hare who promptly whisks her through the looking glass and into the other side of the room where "everything is either very small or I am very large". And when she drinks the mysterious potion to re-

duce her size, we are not totally surprised to discover that her clothes do not shrink with her.

A wide-eved, naked Alice stumbles haplessly into Wonderland and is immediately accosted by three very strange creatures who arouse her to no end by massaging her tender young parts with their fur-padded hands. After this, there's a song and dance routine to compliment the sequence. Then she leaves them to do some "selfexploration" and ends up masturbating on a talking rock that mentally coaxes her into orgasm. ("Does that feel good when you touch yourself? Go ahead. Don't be ashamed. Do it.")

Alice is naturally upset to learn that Mr. Hare is watching the whole affair, but allows him to escort her through the rest of Wonderland and even more sexual experiences: She gives blow jobs to the Mad Hatter, Humpty Dumpty, and the Queen of Hearts ("I want her head!") She turns on to 'watching' Tweedle Dee and Tweedle Dum twiddle with each other's dees and dums; and then with a song, even scolds a capricious young maiden who has impaled herself upon the Black Knight's cock. (***"What's a nice girl like you, doing on a knight like thisss?"***)

The whole thing is pretty silly, and in its silliness it can be fun. But we don't really recommend it to anyone unless, of course, you happen to be straight and have nothing better to occupy your time.

PS YOUR REHEARSAL SHOWS **PROMISE**

It's New Years Eve and Immy Zoole can't seem to get in the holiday spirit. He's 38 years old. He's been robbed twice in the past year. His best friend recently died. His steady girl is leaving him. He's just lost his job to a younger man. His cat is sick. And the only person left to talk to is a gay burglar he's got tied down to the cutting board in his kitchen.

Such is the premise for James Kirkwood's stirring **P.S. Your Cat Is Dead**, a taut, wonderfully comic novel that probes the relationship of these two unlikely characters and generates more laughs per minute than any book we've read to date.

But adapting it to the stage is sticky business. And much of Kirkwood's tense humor lies within his own "depraved" thoughts which, when read, are nothing short of hysterical. So when he adapts these inner thoughts into self-conscious stage mutterings ... watch out. It takes professional actors to carry it off. Without them, the humor (right along with the play) falls flat.

It seems that the burglar, Vito Antenucci, is also a part time hustler who's not getting any younger. He speaks with the fierce New Yorkese accent so seldom heard for real that one suspects it's a put on. And the character Jimmy will *not* be put on by anything. He's fed up with life. He's ready to kill. Torture. Mutilate.

And so you have the two of them celebrating New Years Eve together. Cursing. Shouting obscenities. To relate more of this unusual story would destroy it. But basically you're looking at a personality study that manages, in

its strangeness, to be very funny; not a funny story that just happens to be consumed with strange personalities.

The Montrose Activities Center is producing the two-act play, with opening night slated for October 1st. Director Jack Lampert has high hopes; proceeds for the show will aid the dwindling MAC account.

With the exception of Fred Hinton (who plays Vito), all his actors lack previous stage experience. Such as Gary Von Ottegham, who will portray the character of Jimmy; and Cheryl Markowitz, who plays the strong willed Kate.

We attended a rehearsal of the show (in the basement of the old Flea Market, 701 Franklin) and sat, mildly entertained, through most of the first act. Director Lampert has blocked the show nicely and we see much potential there. There were the expected rough edges; perhaps a few more than had he used experienced actors.


Who knows? This San Francisco adaptation of **P.S. Your Cat Is Dead** may well prove to be a milestone in Houston theatre. It may even prove to be a stepping stone for director Lampert. It's difficult to predict. But unless the show evolves beyond normal expectations, it may end up as something of a millstone around the necks of all concerned.
