




WESTHEIMER ART FESTIVAL

ABC and CBS are to be commended for their treatment of homosexuality in last week's line up of shows (Family, Alice, The Nancy Walker Show) which brought us everything from the wide-eyed naivete' of a gorgeous seventeen year old to the casual air of a successful ex-football player to the campy demeanor of a flop actor. And in each case, gay characters were handled with honesty and taste. (Not so with one of the scripts.)

Let us begin with Family - an updated Ozzie and Harriet by-product of Rich Man/Poor Man sprinkled with a few nice moments that author Gerry Day had trouble exploiting because of all the stock characters wandering around: characters such as Affectionate Mom, Understanding Dad, Troubled Older Sister, With-It Teenage Son, and Precociously Loveable Tomboy. And into this splattering of mediocrity he flung . . . are you ready? Homosexuality! It seems that With-It Son Willie's best friend Zeke is arrested in a gay bar while vacationing home from college. Needless to say, the news does not sit well with straight-thinking Willie, who promptly alienates himself from his buddy, thereby causing all sorts of hurt feelings and suppressed emotions which later surface in the predictable dialogue. Affectionate Mom and Understanding Dad remain affectionate and understanding through most all of it (at one point they even shelter waif Zeke when his own father tosses him out).

We realize that most gays will be



delighted to see a show of this caliber and likewise resent any critisism of the production. After all, doesn't it automatically rate three gold stars since gay Zeke was portrayed as handsome, athletic, and all-round American? No, it doesn't. The first episode of Family contained little more than a series of syrupy confrontations strung together with all the good intentions of better gay/straight media relations. But the show did not enlighten us. Nor did it entertain us. We saw the potential for a very warm and life-like portrait in its conception; and perhaps for the straight world, that's all they can swallow at the moment: potential. But we kept hoping for something more than a modish Leave It To Beaver contrivance that jumped on the gay bandwagon of entertainment, and were disappointed not to receive it.

Next we come to Alice, a half hour situation comedy (based on the hit movie Alice Doesn't Live Here Anymore) which, in its first episode, has the heroine (Linda Lavin) becoming romantically involved with another jock-type gay (Denny Miller; this one an ex-football player who takes her out a few times at the prodding of a co-worker. He ends up confessing his lifestyle before she becomes "too serious" with him. Alice, confused and disenchanted, grasps at the expected


Miller: Alice . . . I'm gay.

Lavin: You don't mean . . . jolly?

Miller: No. Gav. Lavin: Happy? Miller: Gav!

But here's the catch. Prior to this disquieting confession, Alice had asked him to take her eleven year old son on a fishing trip, but afterwards has second thoughts. And later in the show,

when she refuses to let her son accompany the man (by that time the boy has grown quite attached), all hell breaks loose. He storms into the diner where Alice works and demands an explanation that she simply cannot muster. And so the show resolves *its* first episode by helping to destroy the myth which couples child molestation with homosexuals. (This one gets the gold stars). Through it all—there were some pretty funny characters tossed in—we even got a few good yuks.

Though not nearly as many as heaped upon us by **The Nancy Walker Show** (Norman Lear), one of whose *regulars* is a gay live-in secretary that's portrayed with camp by Ken Olfson. But then all the characters in Walker's show are gems. The plot is well handled, the dialogue astonishingly clever; and as for Mrs. Walker . . . she alone could make *anv* show.

Hats off to ABC and CBS for three well-meaning productions. Thumbs down to NBC for running scared. The gay community will remember the sound of political footsteps long after **Snip** has been purged and forgotten.

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


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
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
