

### **TURKEY DINNER**




### NICKEL BEER

### BRIDGE THE GAP AT THE BARN







when Phoebe's depressed!"




"Only in trombones." Vera quipped. "Go ahead. Walk out. Leave us here. Alone. To die."

There she stood. Or semi-stood. Puffed cheeks. Bags under the eyes. Tear streaked. Mascara to the neck. Wearing the shower curtain.


"VEERRAAAAAAA!" Phoebe blurted.



a man you came to me and you touched and held and loved together we scaled the heights of passion and we knew the love of man for man


in my aloneness i see you more clearly than were you before my eyes and i hymn your godhood

### ORLEANS

With more time and space, I would go on in depth about Orleans as the opening act for Jackson Browne's concert at Houston's Summit; but one of their Top-40 hits remains with me as having the strongest impression. The group, led by John Hall, asks if a certain partner would only DANCE WITH ME and be my lover then "even Fantasy could never be so thrilling..."

### SAY A PRAYER FOR THE PRETENDER

Jackson Browne's thought-provoking evening of music left me "drifting on through the night" as the implications of his lyrics continued to sink in.

Browne is probably most remembered for songs (such as AFTER THE DELUGE) in which he envisions the planetary Apocalypse we could experience at any moment ("Don't think it won't happen just because it hasn't happened yet."), and he suggests how we should deal with that constant awareness. His suggestion is that we "take to each other's hearts for refuse."

In his second encore, Browne asks the audience whether they had come to "see the poet bare his soul or had we come to hear the Rock 'n Roll?" --I'd gone to see the Poet for his ideas on love relationships today and how he applies those ideas.

In LATE FOR THE SKY he wonders about those peculiar moments when you look into a lover's eyes and suddenly feel the "empty surprise of seeing someone you'd never known (or would ever know)...I don't know what I loved in you/You don't know what you loved in me...Maybe what you loved in me was a photograph of someone you were hoping I might be...How long have I been dreaming


(foolishly) that I could close my eyes and try with all my might to be the one you need?" Like Orleans, he implies that we can't substitute fantasy or illusion for a lover and hope to make it work. In his FOUNTAIN OF SORROW, Browne again asks how can it be that "your perfect lover can suddenly look like a perfect fool, and so you go off looking for a perfect stranger." Browne believes that the transient nature of relationships today are so prevalent because we have no real faith in the future. He reminds us not to "let the years give way to uncertainty/And the fear of having lived for nothing strangle the will (to survive whatever life offers)." The point is to live, to survive.

His latest album entitled THE **PRETENDER** takes the approach that many others have taken today: He wants to be the "happy idiot and struggle for the legal tender. And believe in whatever may be in those things that money can buy." But Browne's jadedness is not so strong that he doesn't recognize that love does come along "even though (for him) that magic feeling never seems to last." In a song dedicated to his 3-year-old son, Browne sums up his experience with advice to his son we should all take, no matter our age:

When you find a soul which sees into yours, Take care of each other. Just take care of each other.






Gav citizens of Dallas and Fort Worth have encountered intense harassment in the last several weeks. Public officials have openly announced campaigns against the rights of gays. To justify their actions, police officials have strained the interpretation of various state statutes beyond recognition, and have served up the usual line of repressive moral condemnations. Fortunately, the gay communities of the Metroplex have responded to the challenge magnificently. Working together toward a common goal, the Dallas Gay Political Caucas, the local Metropolitan Community Church, and many other elements of the local gay community have collected over \$6,000. Business persons and professionals, working people and students, activists and non-activists, all have risen to the occasion. Outside help has come from Rev. Troy Perry, founder of the Metropolitan Community Church fellowship, and Adam De Dois, director of Gavs on the Hill (MCC's Washington lobby). Even non-gay elements of the traditionally conservative area have given support to the newly formed umbrella organization, Dallas Alliance for Individual Rights (D.A. I. R. ).

We in Houston have been far more fortunate. Attitudes towards gays here have historically been among the most favorable in the country. While the head of the Dallas Vice-squad was announcing his crusade against gays, officials from Houston's Gay Political Caucas were holding a cordial meeting with Capt. Gaines, who heads the Vice-squad here and is now a GPC police liason contact. We are fortunate too in having a number of strong gay activist organizations that have a tradition of working together for a common causes. GPC, MCC, GAA, the Houston Human Rights Defense Foundation and many other groups and individuals recognize common goals and objectives, But we must not be too complacent.

Despite many recent gains, basic attitudes are against us: we live in a sexually repressive society. An example of the constant danger we face is a new organization in Houston called the Committee on Community Standards. Ostensibly seeking to combat pornography, the group's interest has been primarily focused on gay activities. It is attempting to have a city ordinance passed which bans obscenity in the City of Houston. One spokesperson for the group included two persons of the same sex dancing together as an example of pornography. GPC, GAA, the Amer-ican Civil Liberties Union and other interested groups and indivduals are responding to this problem. As always, your help is needed. Both your time and money would assist us in maintaining the friendly climate that Houston has offered to its gay community.

Houston, a few other Texas cities, and now the Metroplex are in a better position to respond to problems that appear on the horizon because we have organized in advance. These organizations must be supported by the community during times of relative quiet as well as in times of strife. I believe that other Texas cities must prepare for some form of assault on their basic rights. The time for gay activist organizations to be formed throughout the state is now. Local organizations designed to meet community needs is what it is all about. GPC, GAA and other gay organizations join me in offering our assistance in helping cities without political organizations to organize while there still is time.
