





NEW SAN ANTONIO BAR




AH MEN'S MOVING



ively overhanging potbelly. Or even part the pubic hairs.



THEATRE: The Ritz

Even if you have already seen Richard Lester's movie version of *The Ritz*, don't be deterred from seeing Bruce Lumpkin's effervescent and thoroughly hilarious stage production at the TUTS Cabaret Theatre in Houston's Shamrock Hilton. You'll probably find yourself laughing more. Lanny Green, as the chubby Gaetano Proclo, was a delight to watch as each turn of the plot and the mounting complications of mistaken identities drove him to hysteria and the audience to hysterical laughter. Jim Henson, as the chubby-chasing Claude Perkins, played a finely tuned performance, especially evident in his orgasmic outbursts whenever he spied anyone in the 250-pound category.

The role of Chris, the ultra-effeminate stereotype, was excellently camped up by Gerry Burkhardt. The falsetto-inflicted detective was played with great timing by Art Yelton.

Pamela Wilson's portrayal of the ill-fated and talentless Googie Gomez was a show stopping performance. Pamela's perfectly (but intentionally) talentless performance as Googie emceeing amateur night at The Pits Club was so well "mis"-choreographed that the audience laughed its way into the intermission holding its sides...

BEYOND THE RITZ BATHS

TUTS' timing in producing *The Ritz* at this *time* is both ironic and important, considering the recent wave of anti-gay sentiment in Dallas and the current foolishness of the Committee on Community Standards in Houston. Although most reviewers have seen *The Ritz* as merely a comic entertainment which takes no real position for or against gays or for or against straights, quite the opposite is the case. There are several examples on both sides.

At one point in the beginning of the first act, Chris (as the self-annointed and reigning queen of the baths) is

giving Gaetano (the straight man hiding out in the baths) a "tour." Chris stops, gets very serious, and tells Proclo bluntly that no matter what straights say about liking and accepting gays it's all "chatter" (Chris' opinion, not mine)...


Now tie in Chris' comment with the exchange between the violently antigay Vespucchi (the brother-in-law trying to kill Proclo) and Claude Perkins. Vespucchi asks Claude contemptuously, "Do you know what we call people like you?" Claude, with great selfcomposure considering Vespucchi has a gun in his face, answers "Yes, fashionable!"-A great comic line that will always brings an audience to laughter. And below the laughter lies the implication of the opposite, i.e., anything fashionable always becomes unfashionable again. Further, anything "tolerated" can just as suddenly become intolerable (as in the waves of oppression which come at the whim's of governing officials).

But Dallas has experienced unexpected results from its decision that gays weren't so "fashionable" in Dallas anymore. The formation of DAIR and an overall strengthening of gay political organizations statewide were the results. (There will always be Vera's to fight...Read this week's episode of *Life with Vera*.)

Gaydom *is* fashionable right now or we wouldn't be seeing *The Ritz* at the Hilton, nor would we have seen the "fashionability" of gaydom on television this season.

In the Ritz Baths it is the Vespucchis and Proclos who were tolerated and forced to accept the rules of the gay world. So, the play closes with the straight world walking out the front door and the baths returning to normal.

This can be seen as an example of how gays, particularly in highly self-ghettoized areas, can come to be just as intolerant of straights as straights can be of gays. There is a definite, if unconscious, sigh of relief from the gay viewer as the straight world leaves the Ritz Baths and the status quo returns.



GAY ENDORSEMENT BENEFICIAL TO POLITICAL CANDIDATES


The Gay Political Caucus has seen uncanny success in its effort to put favorable candidates into office. Since its inception over a year ago, GPC has endorsed candidates in 28 separate races. The overall track record has been outstanding. Of these candidates, 19 were victorious. This 68% success ratio was repeated in last month's election, where five of the seven candidates endorsed by the caucus won.

Typical of the success enjoyed by GPC's endorsees is that of Ron Waters, who represents Montrose and parts of the Heights. In the latest election, he got 67.2% of the total votes cast in Representative District 79. This is a significant increase over the 60.0% and 62.6% which he received in his first two races. This record is especially impressive when one considers that several opponents have attempted to cultivate homophobic sentiment in the district. One opponent was rumored to have sent copies of the GPC endorsement letter to conservative, elderly citizens in the Heights, and directly called Rep. Waters a "Queer". Such scandalous tactics were obviously fruitless.

It is particularly noteworthy that favorable candidates whose districts are not in heavily gay populated areas have been similarly successful. Rep. Craig Washington, whose district is located in the near East Side, won by a heavy majority (although he faced only token opposition.) You may recall that two years ago, he introduced a bill in the Texas Legislature which would have decriminalized private homosexual acts. Many legislators were afraid to support such a measure. Surely, it was not a politically favorable move. Yet this dramatic effort did not cause the political ruin of Rep. Washington. In fact, the gay issue was never brought up in the last election.

The previous examples are repeated often, both in Houston and elsewhere in the nation. Several times, the Gay Political Caucus has had to refrain from openly endorsing candidates because of their fears of voter rejection. Such fears are not without foundation. But one by one these candidates are appealing to the Gays for support. With the increased involvement of the Gay voters and increasing sympathy towards human rights, that appeal is paying off.
