GAY YOUTH CENTER FOR SAN ANTONIO

The proposal requests \$49,340 in revenue sharing funds and has been submitted to the Bexar County Commissioners Court.

According to Jim Eggeling, Executive Director of Forward Foundation, the foundation is presently handling cases of gay juvenile offenders on a volunteer basis, who have been referred to them by other social service agencies. Eggeling said, "There is no program or staffing to accomodate these clients, nor funding, at any governmental or private agency in Texas,

except for the foundation's volunteer program. We are only beginning to understand the depth and magnitude and diversity of the need."

The foundation proposes to raise \$56,463 on its own in addition to the

revenue sharing request.

The Independence House would be located within walking distance of the intersection of Broadway and Houston streets in downtown San Antonio. In addition to the coffeehouse format, the house would offer walk-in counseling and telephone switchboard counseling.


Eggeling emphasizes that Forward Foundation is not a "gay" organization. The foundation was established to combat homophobia-the fear of homosexuality, which is experienced both by homosexuals and heterosexuals-and recognizes homosexuality not as a human condition which is


good or bad, but which just is. When asked if the foundation was in the business of encouraging its clients to be homosexual, Eggeling replied, "Certainly not. Our aim is to help gay youths become good citizens."

A large number of professional advisors have signed on to aid the foundation in realizing this project, including psychologists, sociologists, clergy, physicians, psychiatrists, attorneys, educators, and social workers.

When established, Independence House will expand to provide job counseling for gay youths, and later, to provide a residence for gay youths kicked out of their homes because they are gay.

Phoebe removed his jacket and began beating the flames, while Vera waved his arms and huffed into the air, attempting to disperse the smoke before it was seen.


Eventually, the crisis was brought under control. The flames were extinguished and only red embers, smouldering needles, and a coat with black ashes where the right arm was supposed to be remained.

TWT: Friday December 3 was opening night upstairs at Houston's Depository II where an elegant new room replete with chandeliers, champagne, and reserved seating houses a whole new entertainment troupe, "Tiffany & Company." Prior to the show we visited backstage with the cast: Tiffany Jones, Donna Day, Eartha Kitt and Jerry Vanover. The conversation began with how it all started.

TIFFANY: The idea for this show room started back when I did the Club Baths show at the Old Depository last summer. The owners, Lou and John, said if I ever wanted to do a regular show to give them a call. The idea of coming back to Houston sounded great to do a show like we used to do at the old Red Room when I worked with Jerry Vanover, whom I consider to be one of the funniest comedians I've ever seen. It was Jerry who gave me my start back in 1967. I had my choice, so I picked Jerry, Donna and Eartha.

TWT: The room looks very elegant.

TIFFANY: We wanted a room where people could come in, sit down at a table, order drinks, and see a show. By the way, the shows will be different every Friday, Saturday, Sunday, and Wednesday. There's no standing room. It's all reserved seating.

TWT: Jerry, How does it feel to be back in Houston?

JERRY: It's great to be back with Tiffany doing the kind of shows we used to do.

TWT: What have you been doing since those Red Room days?

JERRY: I've spent the last 4 years

traveling, living in Dallas, and doing spots like Austin Country for Bunch.

TWT: When did you get your start?

JERRY: Back in 1963 at the ol'Nugget, then at the Cabaret.

TIFFANY: Yes, back when Jerry and Paul Stewart were lovers!

JERRY: And, I'm single now, looking and open for suggestions.

TWT: And, Donna, how is it you've moved over here?

DONNA: Here I can do 4 shows a week rather than just one.

TWT: Then doing drag is a career?

JERRY: Right, it's a full time profession. We have no part time jobs. Each of us depends on this show for a comfortable living.

TWT: Donna, didn't you get your start at the Hi-Kamp?

DONNA: That was four years ago. But, actually, I got my start before that in straight clubs. I'm from San Antonio.

TWT: And Eartha?

EARTHA: After much persuasion I've decided to stay in my home of Houston and do the shows here like the ol' Hi-Kamp days.

TWT: Then, you were the last to be hired, Eartha?

JERRY: No! I was. I held back.

TWT: How about real names?

TIFFANY: Mine is Ken Whitehead.

EARTHA: Benjamin Fortune III.

DONNA: Donald G. Shelton.

JERRY: I use my real name on stage.

TWT: Where did the stage names come from?

DONNA: My friends always called me Donna and then Jann Russell gave me my last name, Day, when we did shows at the Hi-Kamp.

EARTHA: Well, it's a long story.

TWT: You have an earthy quality.

TIFFANY: There used to be a comic strip called "Tiffany Jones" and I just took it for myself.

TWT: And the Texas Tornado?

TIFFANY: I don't know.

DONNA: You mean you don't know!

TIFFANY: Well, it's probably from the twirling, whirling I do... sort of like a Tornado spinning.

TWT: And you all live in Houston, now?

TIFFANY: I have a house on the circuit, a big bed and a heaven roommate

JERRY: I live on Driscoll at Westheimer in a duplex.

EARTHA: I'm on the circuit, too, just two blocks from Miss Jones.

DONNA: I live at Queens Haven, the Richmond House.

TWT: How about gay marriages, love and sex?

TIFFANY: It's hell to be a butch drag queen making it hard to have a lover but I'd love to have a lover as I have a lot of love to give.

JERRY: I'm still looking...and waiting and waiting and waiting.

DONNA: Lovers are fine but it takes a good understanding in this life.

EARTHA: With a career it's hard to have a lover. All I have time for is drag and tricks.

TWT: Well, it's about ten o'clock show time so we'll get the Cruise Camera set up. And, thank you and good luck.

TIFFANY: Thank you, can I buy you a drink.

Expect to laugh with the Texas Riders and the Houston Motorcycle





The show will speak for itself...


NOW THAT YOU'VE COME TOGETHER...?

audience. But will it be picked up by the audience and translated into other areas of gay life?


