



Houston's Venture Inn is all cranked up for a gay New Years Eve






LIBRARY REBUFFS CAP



"Oh, that's not it,"Burt muttered, "I just don't feel very festive."




"Why don't you just stock up?" Burt asked. "Go out tonight and buy all they have. And freeze it."


"I would, but I can't afford it. I'm in hock up to my ears." Phoebe said.





"What! What!" Vera yelled, chewing on his paper cup.


"It all began four months ago..." Burt began.

"I now have a LOVER!"




World War III will erupt in the early 80's. China will first have a civil war. Then, China will fight Russa and the USA will help Mother Russia as we did in World War II.




Perhaps it is time for the Mayor to repay the political debt he still owes our community. Perhaps it is time to remind him it was the votes of the Gay precincts that elected him Mayor of this nation's 5th largest city.

Now is not the time to clean out the closet. It is the time to stand up and be counted. A unified Gay society with 200,000 votes can make or break any politician in Houston, and they are all well aware of this fact.

"Together" we can and will be heard.

"Together" we must let it be known that it will be political suicide to stomp the tail of a sleeping tiger. Think about it.

GPC'S POLICY STATEMENT IN RESPONSE TO RAID ON LEVI'S

In the early hours Friday, December 17, 1976, Levi's was raided. Around fifty people were arrested for drinking after hours. They were booked, jailed and bonded out. Later that day, GPC was called and asked to investigate the raid. GPC would like to use this space to make a preliminary report as to what our investigation has revealed and what role the community can expect GPC to play in similar circumstances in the future.

As soon as we heard about the arrests, we began to gather information. We first had to determine whether or not the arrests were for violations of laws which are applied equally regardless of whether the violators are gay or non-gay. A bar manager who was arrested in the raid and who generously posted bond for all those arrested, informed us that there was a clear violation of a strictly enforced ordinance dealing with serving and consuming drinks after hours. Our next question was whether it was harassment to arrest those persons who were consuming alcohol after hours as well as those serving the drinks. We have not completed this phase of the investigation, but it appears that such arrests are general practice in after hours raids.

In cases where there are arrests for violations of laws which are enforced equally against all persons regardless of sexual or affectional preference, it is GPC policy not to become involved in litigating the constitutionality of those laws or their enforcement. That is not to say that the Gay Political Caucus is not concerned about these problems, but it is a recognition that we have limited resources and that there are groups better equipped to deal with these problems. For example, we are

working hard at establishing a significant gay presence in the local chapter of the American Civil Liberties Union (you will be hearing more about this project in the near future). The ACLU deals with such problems on a regular basis and has greater legal resources at its disposal.

There is a second aspect to any arrest which GPC investigates in order to determine whether or not it should take action in a particular situation. That aspect deals with the treatment of the person arrested. Even when being arrested, a person deserves respect and humane treatment. A police officer has no justification for using violence or abusive language against a non-resisting person. That type of harassment is difficult to prove, but GPC nonetheless considers it our duty to act when a pattern of



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harassment is found to exist. To prove such a case, we must have firm documentation to take to the appropriate authorities. We need the help of persons who have been the victims of harassment in order to effectively deal with this problem.

If you feel that you were the victim of harassment during the raid on Levi's, please give us the following written information: your name, the name or badge number of the officer who harrassed you (if you have them), exactly what happened, and how we can reach you. If faced with similar situations in the future, remain calm, observe as many details as you can, write down all the information that you can recall and send it to us as soon as possible.

GPC is working to insure equal treatment under the law for all persons regardless of sexual or affectional preference. In order to deal with police harrassment effectively, we need your information, your support and your patience. It is a problem which has been with us far too long, and we are working as best we can to minimize if not eliminate it.






