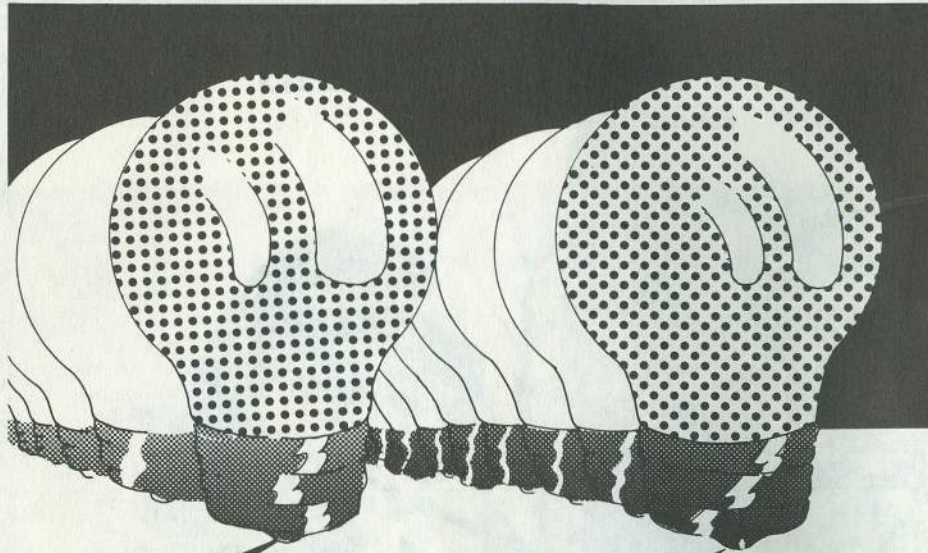

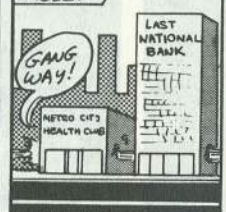

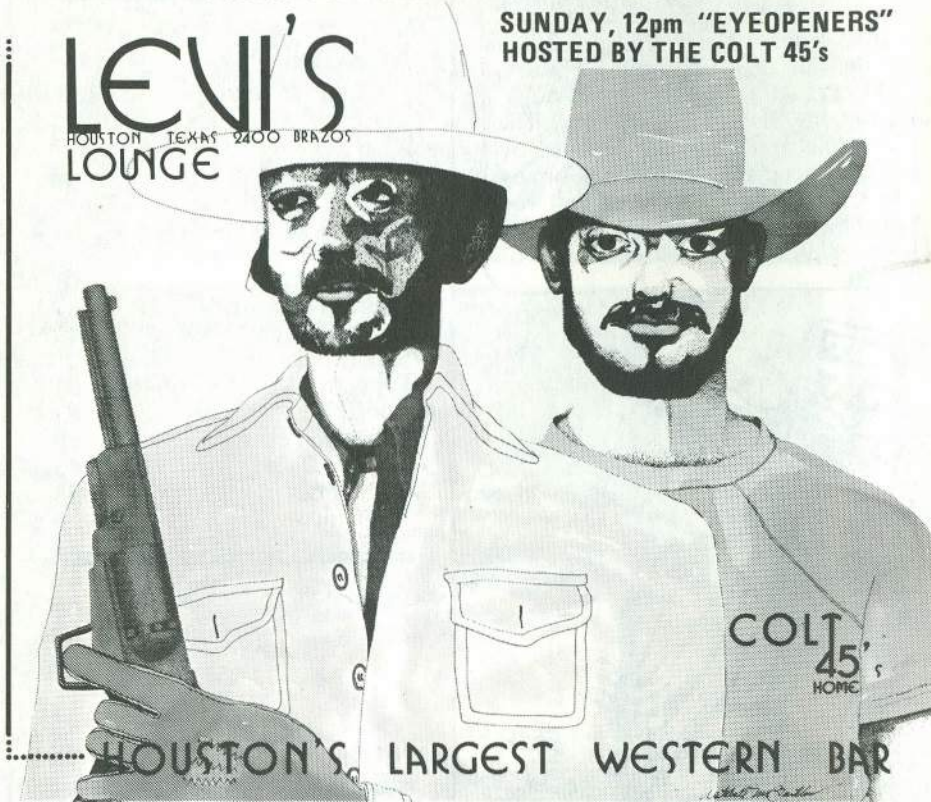

NGTF MEETS WITH PRESIDENT'S ASSISTANT AT WHITE HOUSE

For the first time in the history of the U.S., a top-level official at the White House has met with representatives of this nation's second-largest minority, the estimated 20,000,000 lesbians and gay men. At a two-hour meeting on February 8, Margaret Costanza, Presidential Assistant for Public Liaison, met with Jean O'Leary and Bruce Voeller, Co-Executive Directors of the National Gay Task Force, to discuss issues involving official discrimination in such areas as the military, immigration and naturalization, treatment of federal prisoners, and IRS tax-deductible status.

Following the meeting, Ms. Costanza prepared a summation letter in which she stated, "I have been impressed with the presentation you have made and wish to explore more fully the role my office and I can play; specifically in facilitating meetings with those persons who will be most helpful to you in the areas we have reviewed."

Ms. Costanza and her staff will host another meeting with representatives of the lesbian and gay communities at the White House on March 26, 1977, to discuss these issues in greater detail. At that time Ms. O'Leary and Dr. Voeller will head a ten-person delegation. The members of this group have not as yet been selected, but the NGTF officers have stated that it will include "equal numbers of women and men, all of whom can provide expertise in the various areas to be discussed." This meeting is planned as a prelude to further discussions on specific issues with federal officials in the relevant areas.

TUCSON PASSES GAY RIGHTS BILL

On February 7, 1977, Tucson, Arizona, became the 39th community in the U.S. to pass a gay civil-rights bill. It was the second community to pass such legislation this year, following Dad County, Florida (including Miami and the surrounding area).

The Tucson bill, which was passed unanimously by the newly-elected

seven-member City Council, is also one of the most comprehensive such bills in the nation. It forbids both public and private discrimination on the basis of "sexual or affectional preference or marital status" in the areas of employment, housing, public accommodations, credit, lending and insurance. It also bars personal discriminatory practices and aiding and abetting such practices. Unlike most other cities with gay-rights legislation, Tucson's bill empowers the city attorney to prosecute rather than requiring those discriminated against to appeal to the local Human Rights Commission.

According to members of the Tucson Gay Coalition, a factor which influenced members of the council to support gay rights was the recent brutal murder of a gay man by a gang of teenagers and the controversial sentencing of the culprits to probation and what amounted to a reprimand from the judge.

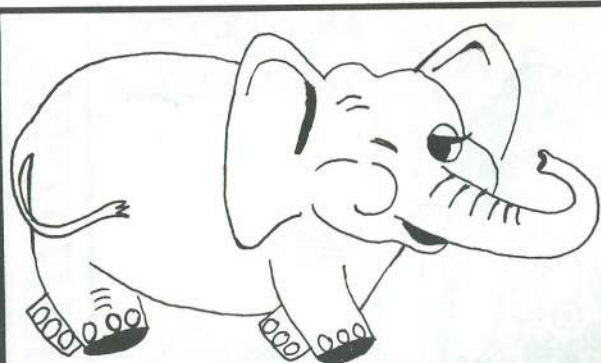

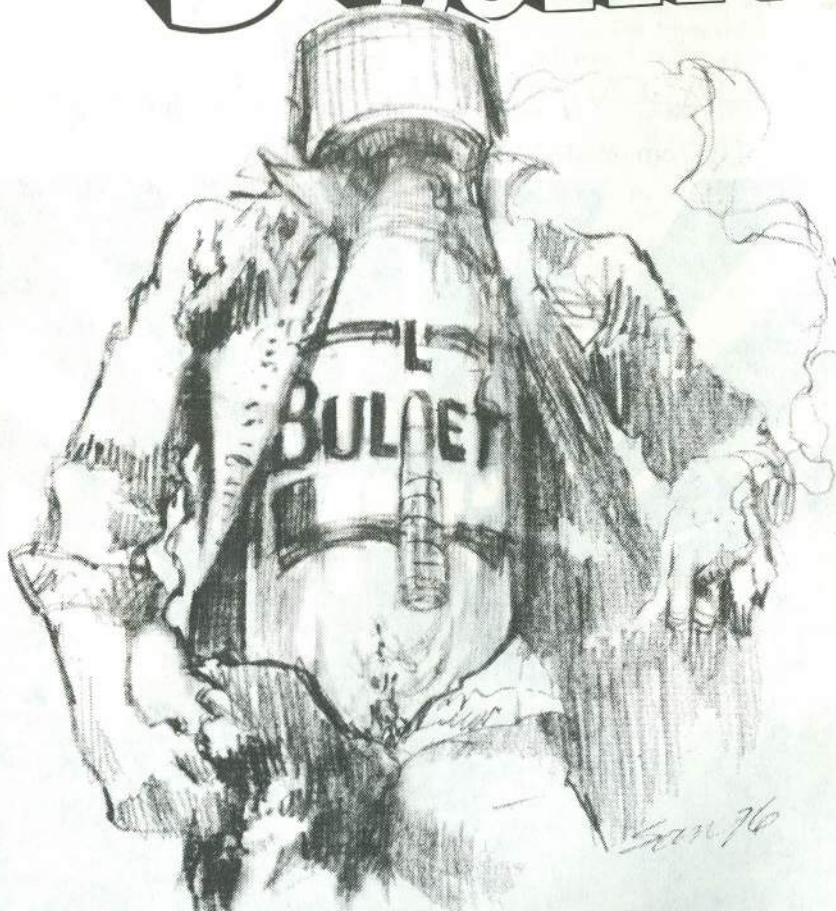

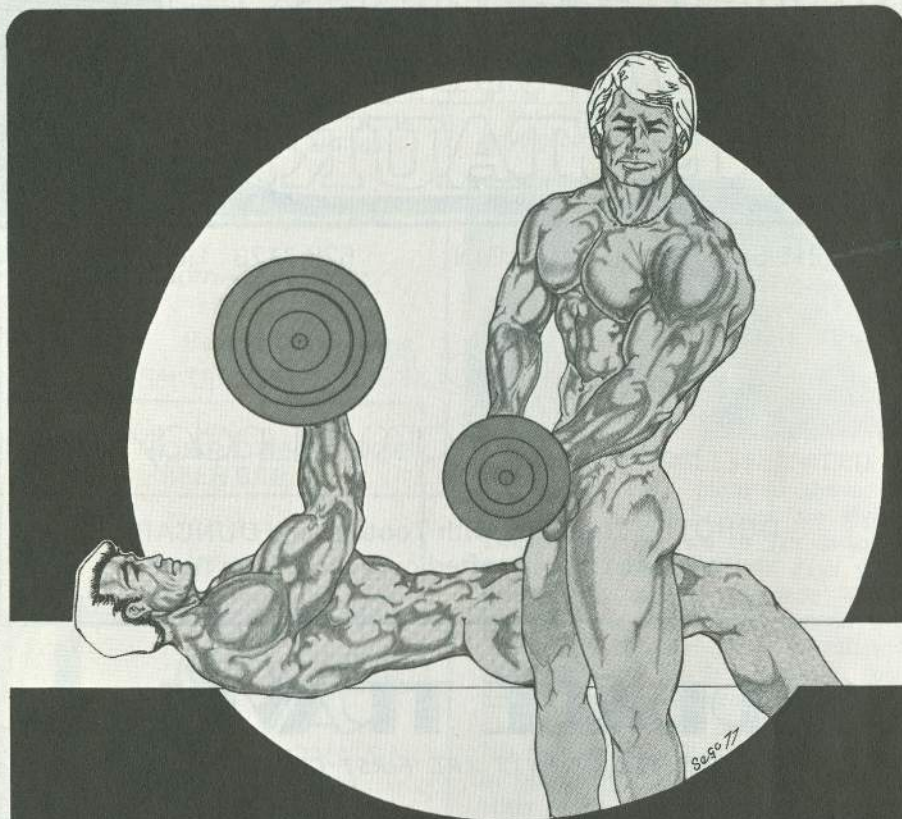

polls. Only then will be able to make progress toward achieving two of our important goals. the passage of a municipal anti-discrimination ordinance and holding back the forces of repression, particularly those represented by the Committee on Community Standards. Other communities, Austin in the past and most recently Tucson, Arizona, have enacted tough new ordinances which protect the rights of gays in housing and employment. With hard word and the cooperation of other minorities, the coming elections offer us the opportunity of proving to the members of the City Council that we are a political force that must be reckoned with. Legally protected civil rights for all minorities, including gays, can become a reality in the near future only if we have broad based cooperation from the various elements in the gay community. The forces of repression are quite active again this year. The Committee on Community Standards continues its fight against the First Amendment's guarantees protecting freedom of expression. As we have become more familiar with this group, we have come to understand that it is deeply homophobic, and if left unchecked, will become a nucleus of other forces opposing our efforts at obtaining equal rights. We believe that we will find that candidates in favor of gay rights will also favor freedom of expression."

The speakers closed their presentation with a plea for help. The elections are much closer than the calendar implies. Thousands of hours are needed to canvas voters, organize a massive voter registration campaign, stuff envelopes, and accomplish other essential time consuming tasks. "The message should be clear," Schwab closed, "we need your active involvement to help make Houston a better place for all of us."

The most popular item of discussion in entertainment circles is the announcement of nominees for the annual Academy Awards to be awarded on March 29. There were more than a few surprises in the announcements; most notable that *A Star is Born* received no nominations in the major categories such as best picture, best actress, and best actor, and that neither Robert Redford nor Dustin Hoffman received a nomination for their fine portrayals in *All the President's Men*. Of course, it would be nearly impossible for everyone to be satisfied with the nominees, and that means there are sure to be disappointments for everyone. It would be hard to fault the Academy's selections of nominees for best picture, however. All five nominees—*All the President's Men*, *Bound for Glory*, *Network*, *Rocky*, and *Taxi Driver*—are fine

films, and it will be interesting to see which copes the top prize. It would be idle speculation for me to make any guesses as to who the winners will be, at least at this stage, but stay tuned for some interesting background material on all the nominees in future columns. 

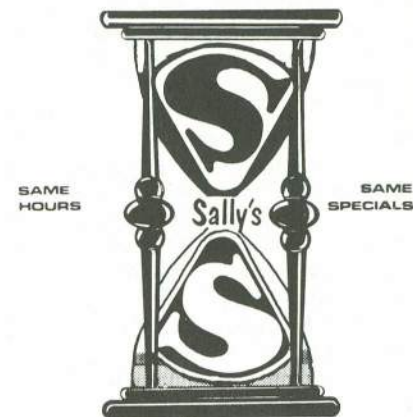
Big hoopla buildup is already being used for the promotion of *The Island of Dr. Moreau*, which will star

Insiders say the reason Woody's been so tight-lipped concerning this latest project is that it's really the story of his and Keaton's love affair and marriage.

Broadway hits currently undergoing film treatment include *Hair* (at last, and probably too late), and *Equus*. In case you're holding your breath waiting for *A Chorus Line* to be made into a movie, you can exhale. It'll be at least two years, maybe longer, before it can be done. There are just too many road productions that have to run their courses first.

Dennis Foley last season on *Mary Hartman, Mary Hartman* will be seeing more of him on Art Carney's new series this fall, entitled *Lanigan's Rabbi*.

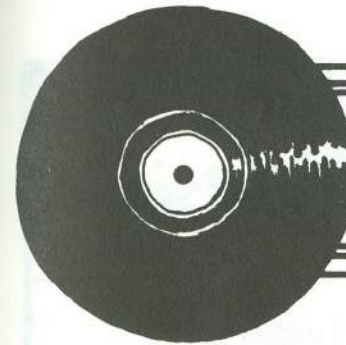

From inside a disco's sound booth, the most frequently heard question is "What?"

This is because discos are loud, and most of the booths are placed where the music can be heard well. The DJ's answer to a customer's question can't be heard very well at all. Here, then, are answers to the most frequently asked questions.

Q: What's that song you're playing?

A: For the past few months the answers usually have been either:

1. "My Sweet Summer Suite" by the Love Unlimited Orchestra (Barry White). This is the one with lots of drums, a short cymbal break, big orchestration, and no singing. The long version heard at most clubs isn't available to the public. It was a special disco pressing. Their new release "Theme from King Kong" is for sale as a "giant 45."

2. "You + Me = Love" by the Undisputed Truth. (Remember "Smiling Faces"?) This one is 11 minutes long and has been around most of the year. Even so, it's probably still the most requested song. Screaming female vocal and several instrumental breaks. Their album is finally out, with the long version intact, along with their new release, "Let's Go Down to the Disco."

Q: Would you play...?

A: We try, but...folks usually seem to request a record right after they come into the club. They have an uncanny knack for choosing a tune that was played just before they walked in. Even the most popular songs are only played two or three times nightly, so

it's usually two or three hours between plays. With old records your chances are better, but still many discos don't maintain big record libraries, and the selection may be limited to whatever the DJ has brought to him. Also, if an "oldie" was played a night or two before, chances are slim you'll hear it again so soon.

Q: Would you play a slow song?

A: Sometimes yes, sometimes no. Especially in bigger bars, slow songs seem to bring the whole place to a standstill. The big clubs on the coasts play no slow music, and the reasoning seems sound. It just takes too long to bring the place back up.

Footnotes: The Miracles have just joined the list of artists who've walked out on Motown. (Others include Gladys Knight, the Four Tops, and the Jacksons.) The Miracles' new release on Columbia, "Spy for Brotherhood," is like their last Motown album. You've probably never heard it.
