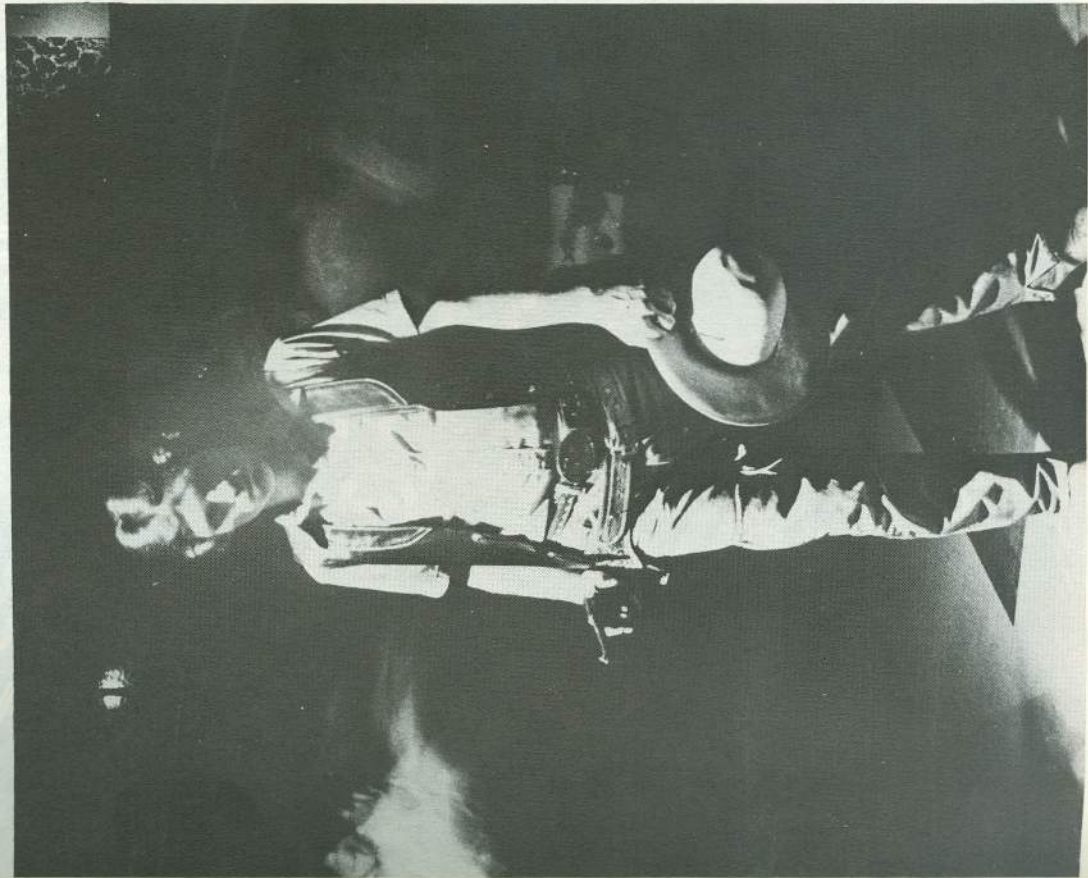

POLICE BECOME BORED WITH REAL CRIME

On Wednesday, May 4, two HPD vice officers worked for several hours to set up a back room raid at Studz News on West Alabama. They finally closed in with armed uniformed police at 6:30pm and arrested five customers and the clerk. Four of the five customers were charged with homosexual conduct under Section 21.06 of the Texas Penal Code. One was charged with solicitation for prostitution, and the clerk was charged with aiding and abetting prostitution. The management of Studz bailed all six victims out of jail within 12 hours. Upon assurances from all six individuals that they would appear in court to contest these charges, Studz secured the services of Mr. Clyde Woody, a Houston attorney noted for his success in handling a variety of human rights cases involving constitutional questions, to represent the six victims of this raid.

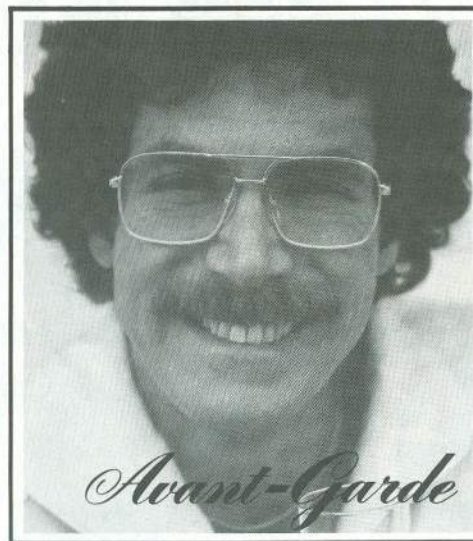
About a week prior to this incident at Studz, vice officers in Dallas entered

the Club Baths and arrested ten persons on charges of homosexual conduct. Wayne Shrebe, general manager of the Club Bath Chain in Texas, told TWT that several of the victims charged in this raid had agreed to fight the rap and that attorneys for CBC, along with the National Committee for Sexual Civil Liberties, had instituted proceedings challenging the constitutionality of 21.06.

On Sunday, May 8, at 12:30am, Houston vice officers entered Mr. Peepers Glory Hole Private Sector and arrested four members of this private club on charges of public lewdness. The clerk at the Glory hole was arrested for obstructing justice because he had recognized the vice officers and refused them admission to the club. Again, the management of this gay club posted bond for the victims of the raid and is securing legal aid on behalf of all those arrested.

It seems to TWT that the Houston and Dallas police departments have become bored with mundane daily cases such as murder, mugging, robbery, and rape and are instead getting their jollies

"Even after you see what this shrubbery has done to my skin? You know I seldom..."

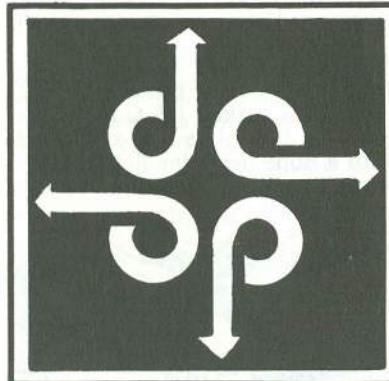

It all started with Uncle Miltie back in the 50's: In the 20-odd years since, gay character portrayals on TV have come a long way. And the '76-'77 season saw an unprecedented number of gay characters in prime time. But quantity doesn't necessarily mean quality. Now that the TV season is officially over and reruns are upon us, it's time to look back and see what quality, if any, there was.

The gay-themed shows that garnered the most interest were the situation comedies. All the most popular comedies featured at least one gay character or story. Unfortunately, whether the show was *Maude*, *Phyllis*, or *All in the Family* the gay character nearly always wound up as the butt of some very bad jokes.


Sometimes this was amusing, as when Archie Bunker encountered a transvestite. Sometimes it was tiresome, as when *CPO Sharkey's* men suspected him of being gay because of his "symptoms." It could even be downright

insulting, as with Nancy Walker's male secretary Terry, who was every tired cliché in the book. In fact, it was rare when the gay character was treated compassionately. On the *Bob Newhart Show*, a new member to the therapy group was discovered to be gay, and the show gave him fair treatment in terms of his common problems with the other group members. In the end, though, the usual jokes surfaced: Bob kept his distance when the two were alone. Even more interestingly, the series fell into the family hour shortly thereafter, and the gay character was never heard from again.

On the dramatic shows, portrayals could be immeasurably worse or better. At NBC, the brass was still smarting from the adverse publicity they received when militant feminists attacked a very anti-lesbian segment of *Police Woman* a few seasons back. The segment was called *Flowers of Evil*, and it dealt

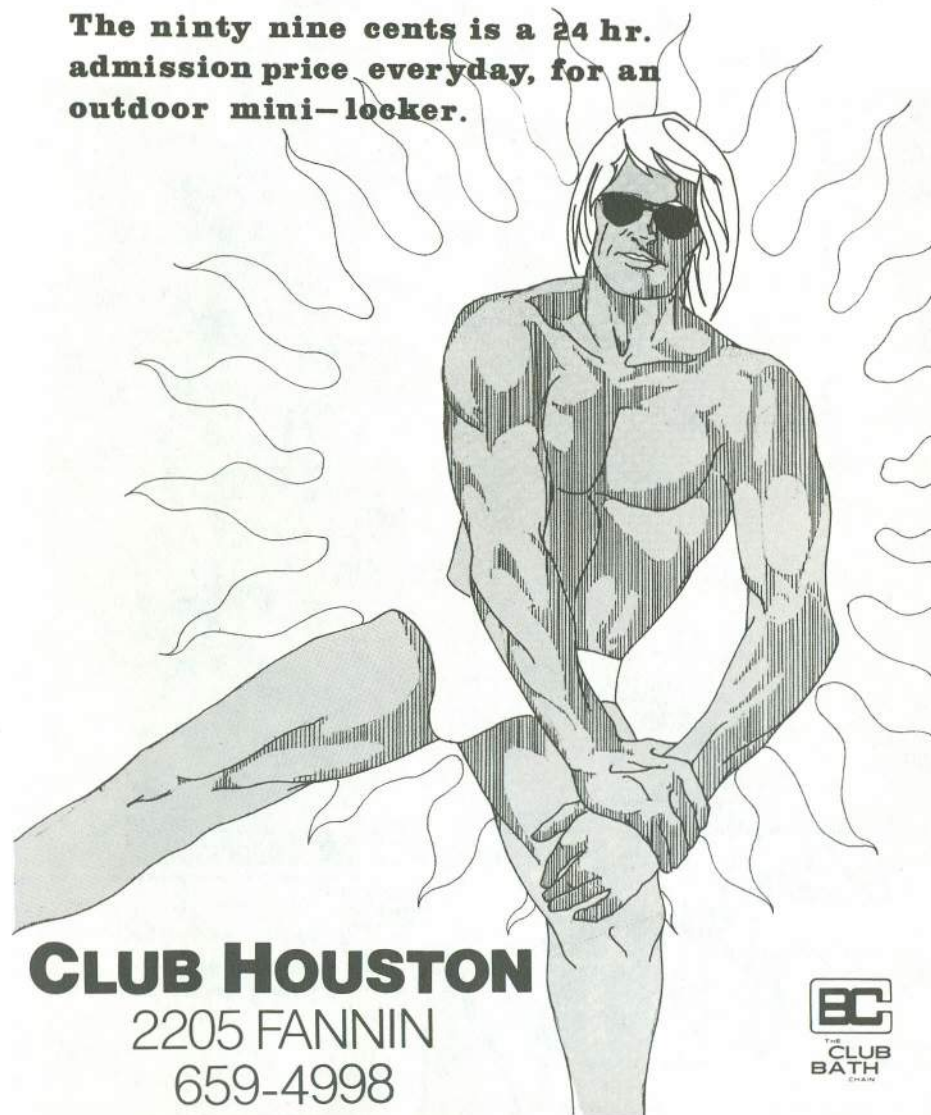

with a group of murderers who also happened to be gay women. The media attention from the incident obviously affected NBC's judgment as far as gay characters. This season, in another *Police Woman*, the subject was dealt with in a much more realistic and humanistic way; the show's gay character was a very qualified police woman who had been forced to resign (unjustly) because of her gayness.

NBC also aired a Made-for-TV movie in which gayness was central to the plot, but thankfully was not *the* plot, for once. Meanwhile, on ABC, a segment of *Family* dealt compassionately with a young man's coming out.

On the negative side, there was CBS's *Cage Without a Key*, which made the lesbians the "bad Guy," and the *Streets of San Francisco* segment that taught us that transvestites were not only sick, they were killers as well. *Kojak* gave the impression that Telly's reason for chas-

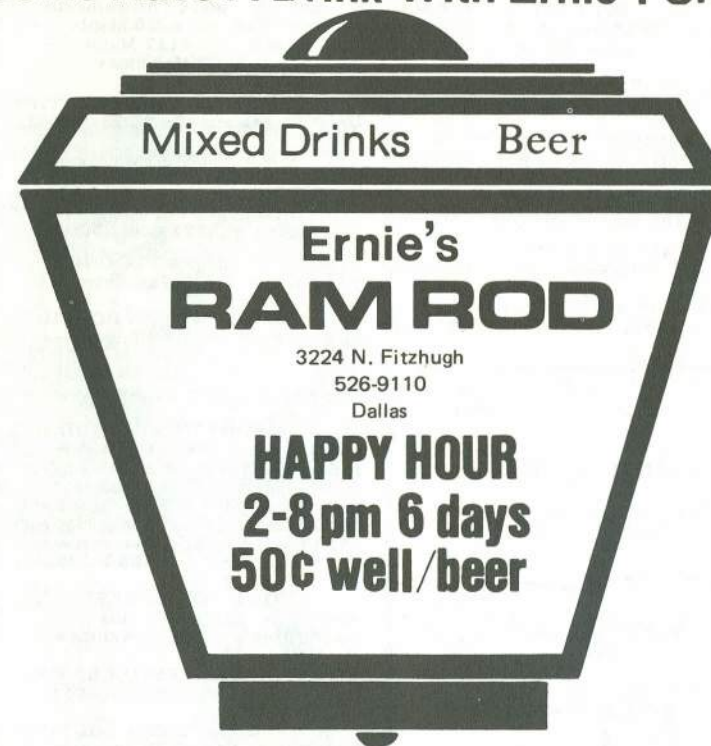

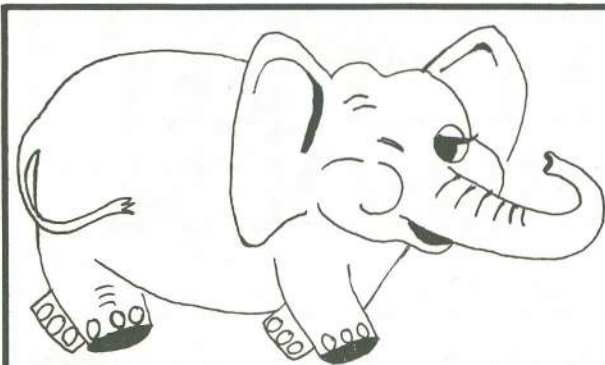
