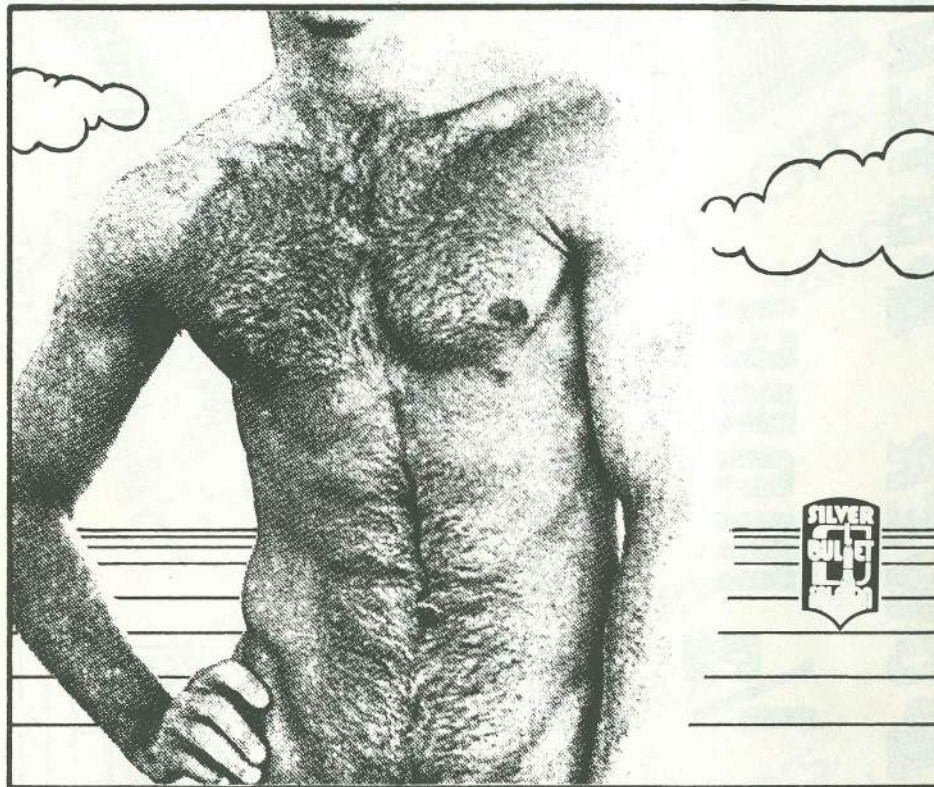

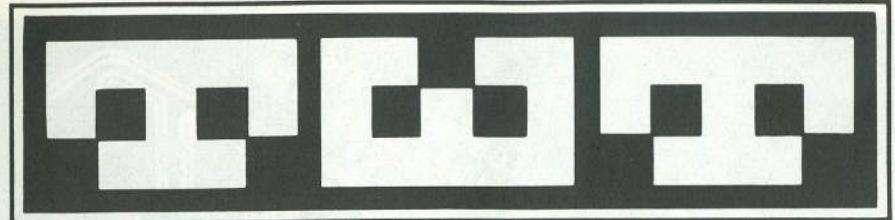

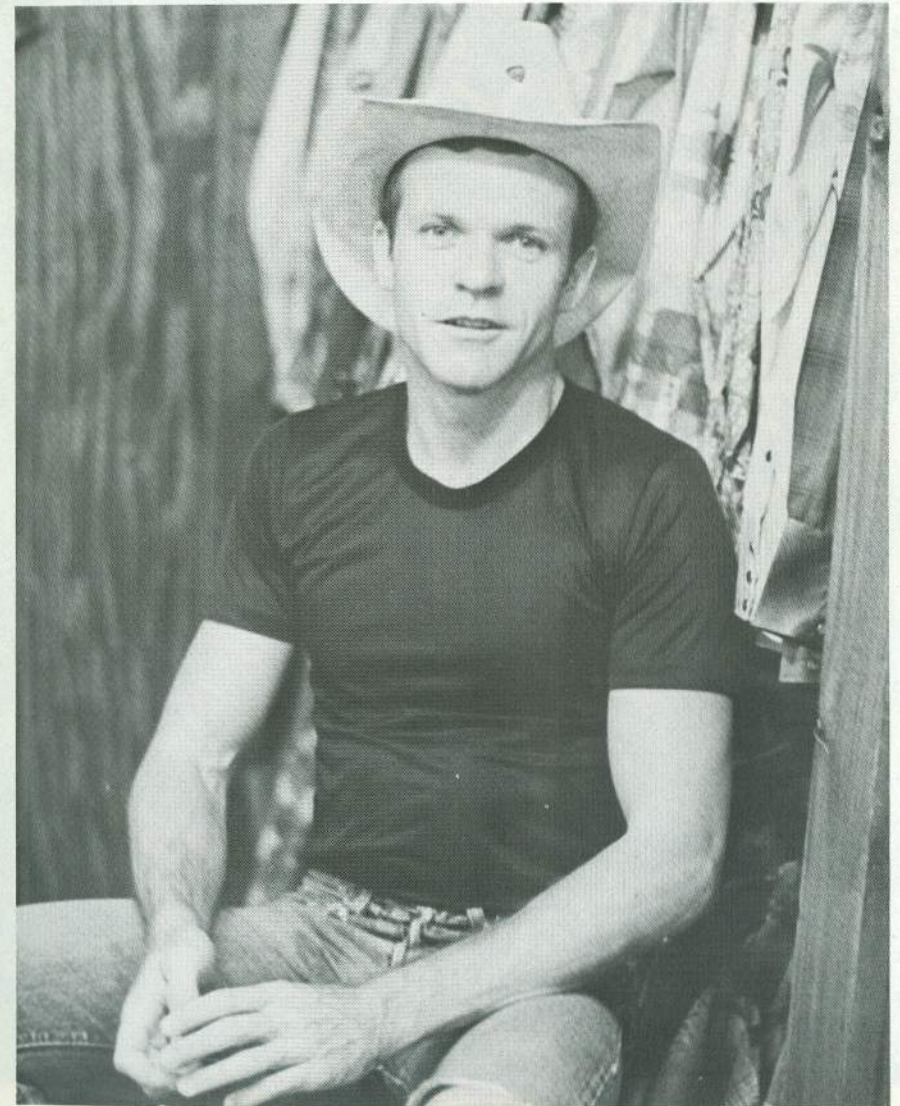

OP HOUSTON FIRE

Early Friday morning, June 10, at 4:30am, the Old Plantation at 2020 Kipling in Houston suffered fire and water damage from a contained fire which police suspect was arson. Howard Neese, manager, said authorities found footprints on the roof where gasoline was poured into the ventilation system and set fire. Fortunately, the automatic sprinkler system and alarm went off, holding the fire to only 15 minutes and damage was not extensive.

ROBBERY AT LEVI'S

Early Tuesday morning, June 14, at

4:30am, a major robbery occurred at the Maple Western Shop located in the patio of Levi's at 2400 Brazos in Houston. Manager Bob Jones said the rip-off artist obtained entry thru the roof ventilator and made off with over \$13,000 in fine jewelry and clothing, leaving behind a trail of western shirts across the patio to the fence.

Authorities suspect some tie-in with the OP fire since both incidents happened at the same time in the early am and in the same rooftop style. Contact Levi's if you have any information.

MIAMI AFTERMATH

As Florida Governor Askew was signing the anti-gay bill into law, other noted men have come to our defense. New York Democrat Koch called the vote "regrettable." San Francisco Mayor Moscone said the Miami vote was "unfair." Jack Campbell, Chairman of the Dade County Coalition for Human Rights said, "It's unconstitutional to subject human rights to a referendum...we may go to court." A Denver rally deplored Anita Bryant's zealous use of religion by saying "God seems to get credit whether he wants it or not." Other demonstrations have occurred along Anita's singing-tour trail in New Orleans, San Antonio, Houston, and New York City. In Norfolk, Virginia, over 300 gays walked out on a Bryant concert when she read from the Bible.

Analysts say there are several reasons why the gays lost 2 to 1 in Miami. Elections are always won by the majority and only 6% of Miami is gay, making it a near impossibility for 6% to garner 51% support. The real issue was clouded over by a TV media blitz, and the ballot wording was cumbersome. In order to vote a "no" you had to vote "yes" and to vote "for" you had to pull the lever marked "against."

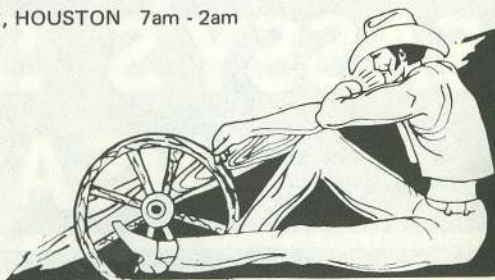

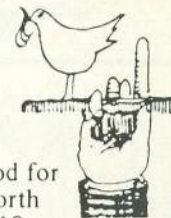

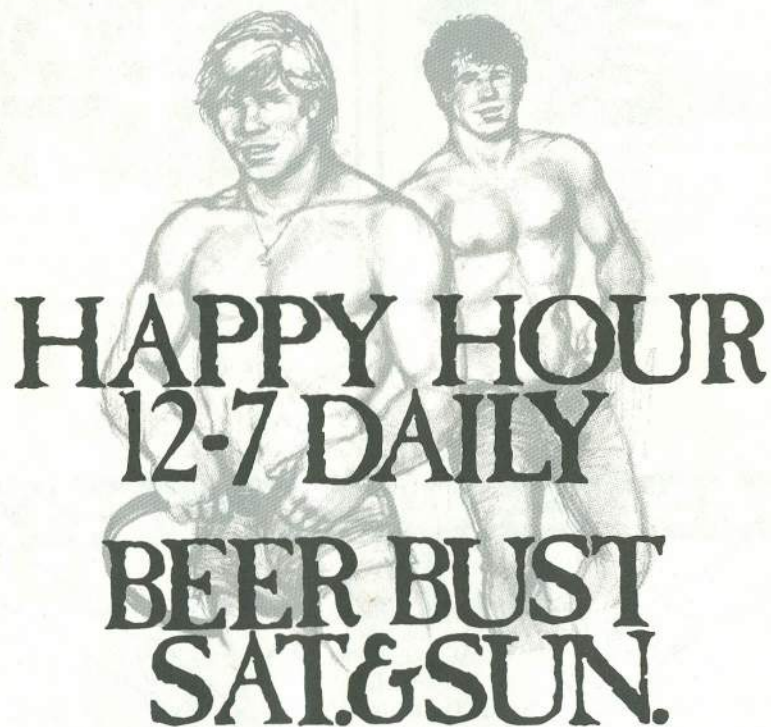

The *Star Wars* phenomenon is sweeping Texas and the nation in a way no one could have foreseen. The science-fiction flick is the most talked-about film in many a season, and with good reason. It's a fantasy set in another galaxy in the far distant past; the film is creative, captivating, and most importantly, totally unpretentious, quality entertainment. In its first weeks, the receipts from the box offices across the country are rivaling *Jaws*' initial success. The man responsible for *Star Wars* is George Lucas, the film's writer/director whose only important earlier film was *American Graffiti*; and he is already at work on *Star Wars II*.

The end of June should see the release of the long-awaited *New York, New York*. The film is several months late, but those who have previewed the final product say it was worth the wait. The movie co-stars Liza Minnelli and hot property Robert DeNiro. Mary Kay Place has a part also.

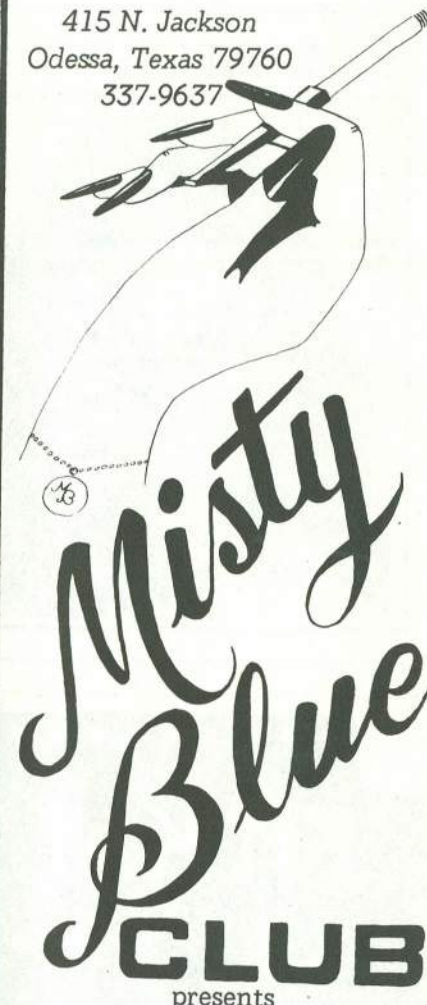
July will see the release of *The Other Side of Midnight*, adapted from the best-selling novel. Susan Sarandon and John Beck co-star. *Fire Sale*, a comedy combining the talents of Alan Arkin and Rob Reiner, will be released in August.

Other films in production are: *High Anxiety*, a Mel Brooks spoof of Hitchcock thrillers like *Psycho* and *The Birds*; *Autumn Sonata*, an Ingmar Bergman film starring Liv Ullman; and (possibly) a remake of the classic *Here Comes Mr. Jordan* with Warren Beatty and Robert Young.

Video Corn: CBS announced last week that it had purchased the TV broadcast of the box-office hit *Network*. The film earned several Oscars this year, including Best Acting awards for three of its stars. It will be televised season after next. CBS paid \$5 million for the rights.

and II, which will include footage never before seen. The show will be aired on consecutive nights (a la *Roots*) next season.

CBS has plans for a mini-series treatment of Tommy Thompson's novel *Blood and Money*. The film will be shot in Houston. The novel concerns the murders of Houston's Dr. John Hill and his socialite wife. CBS also announced fall specials for Natalie Cole, Lily Tomlin, Bea Arthur, and Linda Ronstadt. In addition, work has started on a TV-movie directed by Paul Newman and starring Joanne Woodward, tentatively titled *See How She Runs*. It's about a 40-year-old woman entering the Boston Marathon.

ABC affiliates held their annual meeting to examine the fall schedule, and started a controversy over one of the new shows called *Soap*. It's a comedy spoofing "daytime dramas" (soap operas to you and me) that has struck some local stations as too racy. One plotline centers around one of the main characters' sons who is gay and wants a sex change. ABC programming chief Fred Silverman is strongly behind the new show and chances are it will make it onto the air.

Congressional pressure and parental concern over the volume of violence in prime-time programming have led to

some promises on the part of the networks. All three networks are promising less violence and more "character development" on their prime-time series. Incidentally, all but three of the series judged "most violent" this season were canceled.

Just popped: Farrah Fawcett-Majors still hasn't decided if she'll be returning as one of Charlie's Angels next season, so the show's producers have lined up a replacement...Houston's Alley Theatre has announced its Summer Film Festival. Rudolph Nureyev will make his screen debut as Valentino in Ken Russell's *Valentino*... The war movie of the year will be Joseph E. Levine's *A Bridge Too Far*, starring James Caan, Michael Caine, Sean Connery, Elliot Gould, Gene Hackman, Laurence Olivier, Ryan O'Neal, Robert Redford, Liv Ullman, and many others... There's a movement in Hollywood for a huge tribute to the late Joan Crawford who died without any of the usual tributes most of Hollywood's greats receive.

FOR ALL SIGNS: Summer officially begins Tuesday, June 21, at 7:15am when the Sun moves from Gemini into Cancer.
