AUSTIN HEARINGS

An Austin judge has ruled that Austin's famed "Hippie Hollow" may remain open but chastised both its users and the Lower Colorado River Authority and told them both to literally clean up their act.

According to UT Daily Texan reporter Henry Urick, the hearings included some "hoopla over some gay sex before a woman and her infant." Some comment was also made about the trash left in the area by its users.

Urick offered two suggestions for users of Hippie Hollow: "We should remember what the bushes are for when we are out at the Hollow. If you pack it in, pack it out."

The Austin City Council passed a Fair Housing ordinance which was considerably watered down from the original version. The ordinance passed on first reading with a clause banning housing discrimination based on, among other things, "sexual orientation."

Then local realtor Nelson Puett sent warning letters to Austin businessmen prior to the public hearing on the proposed ordinance. After much pro and con testimony at the hearing, Mayor Carole McClellan's amended version of the ordinance, which eliminated references to sexual orientation, was passed 4-3.

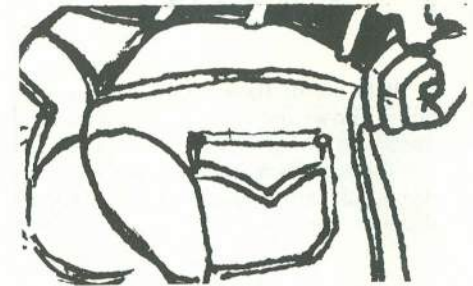
in the front door, there were no yells of "Surprise!" No guests. No gifts. No mushy kisses and groping. Vera really was surprised. And hurt.

"Now, boys," Vera asked, "I understand you have something you want to ask me?"

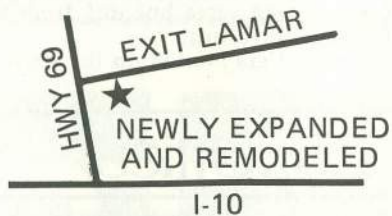
