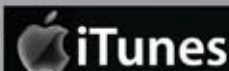

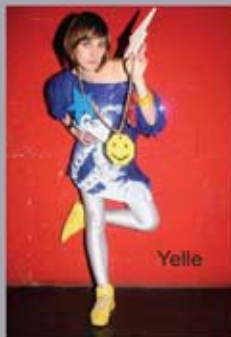
Howdy disco citizens! It's time for your weekly dose of Groovelines – your source for what's hot and hip in the land of electronic dance music and beyond.

Miss America: A MEXICANITO FAIRY'S TALE

When one thinks of San Antonio, it probably isn't because of its live theater scene. Not that there isn't live theater in the Alamo City...it's just not what makes SA famous. Unless Jesus Alonzo has something to say about it.

Alonzo is a native-born San Antonian and playwright whose work includes *Jotos del Barrio*, which was produced several years ago at the Jump-Start Performance Company, and his latest effort, *Miss America: A Mexicanito Fairy's Tale*, which opens next Friday for a three-weekend run at the Esperanza Peace and Justice Center – and, quite significantly, stars the legendary Erica Andrews!

Our Special Features Editor, Mario Mares, sat down with Jesus to find out more about this new work and the man that created it.

Are you a native San Antonian?

Yes, I was born in San Antonio. My father came to the U.S. from northern Mexico about 43 years ago and lived in different cities, including Chicago, Edinburg, and throughout the Texas valley. About 38 years ago he brought my mother, my two sisters, and my eldest brother over and, thankfully, settled in San Anto (as I like to call it).

What got you involved in becoming a playwright? Did you get hooked in high school in plays or was this while attending college?

I am not sure that any one thing really got me into playwrighting other than my love for stories that are attached to personal experiences and memories. I've always had an inclination to the dramatic – and often times, the melodramatic! I participated in plays as early as elementary school, but never saw myself as an actor, though I enjoy it. As a writer, I've always seen myself as a poet with a story to tell; but then these poems get really lengthy and I am definitely not one for sonnets or anything epic like that – I'm more of a Haiku kind of guy! So from that, I guess I evolved into writing short stories, which I absolutely love. The thing about some of these short stories is that their characters just pop off the page as I write their dialogue. These characters take on a life all their own and sooner or later command to be on stage. By that point I'm totally into them and like any good lover, I oblige.

What other works are you known for?

The only other dramatic work that I am known for is *Jotos del Barrio*, a play that combines poetry, prose, and drama to retell the stories and experiences of different Mexican-American/Chicano young men coming to grips with their sexual, gender, cultural, and ethnic identities. It was originally produced as a work in progress at the Esperanza Peace and Justice Center in 1996 and then as a full scale production at the Jump-Start Performance Co. in 2002.

A funny story about this piece: it was never written for production. I actually wrote it in response to a "Queers in Film and Art" class I took my first year in college. The professor dedicated one class to "multicultural perspectives" of queer identity in film. And although the artists represented were all great, they were all African-American, which to me said that we were once again speaking of multiculturalism as a "Black and White" issue when it's really not, especially in LGBT communities. For my final project I decided to give the professor my perspective of queer identity. The end result was *Jotos del Barrio*. She gave me a B-. Ha!

Tell me about, "Miss America, A Mexicanito Fairy's Tale"?

Miss America tells the story of Chuy, a young Mexican-American boy who dreams of being Miss America but who is unaware of his gender, his class, his race and the explosive nature of these elements in larger society – I mean, he's only nine years old! With the help of his family and friends, la Virgen de Guadalupe, Miss Texas, and a fairy godmother, Chuy comes to terms with these aspects of his identity in realizing his dream.



Can you give me some insight on working with Director Maria A. Ibarra?

I can't even answer how amazing it is to work with Maria. I have tremendous respect for her and absolutely trust her with my work. She directed *Jotos del Barrio*, and I remember watching her treat every piece and every player with so much love for the craft of acting. She never told anyone what to do or how to act a part. Instead she directed them, guided them even, to finding the character within them and then to bringing that character to life. The first time I saw the show I thought it was so good and I kept asking myself, "Who the hell wrote this show?" The words were mine, but, wow, the show belonged to the players, the crew members and Maria. And that was an honor beyond belief;

to have people take something I created and so honorably and respectfully exhibit it to the world. But this could only happen with a great director and Maria sets the standard for what a great director is.



I notice that the Legendary Erica Andrews is in your play. I know she is famous for all her National Titles. I have the pleasure of being a friend of Erica. What is it like having her in one of your plays?

If Maria sets the standard for a great director, then Erica sets the (very high) standard for a professional actor. I, personally,

still become very nervous and giddy every time I am in her presence – I mean, she's a celebrity, she's a hero and mentor to so many, she's one of ours from San Anto, and she's just an all around good, good person. Oh yeah, and she's doing our show! That is sometimes still very unbelievable to me: 'Erica Andrews acting in something I wrote? What!?' She brought the house to its feet in our first show, and I am excited to see what she does with *Miss America*, which – I confess – I wrote the leading female role with her in mind, hoping she would do it.



Do you have any plans to try and take your work to other cities? Perhaps eventually having it in New York? Los Angeles?

I love the idea of taking this show on the road to any city where there is an audience for it. I am not sure it's the type of show to go under "Big Lights;" I'm just not that type of writer. I believe in "the theatre of the people and for the people." Therefore, location is not as important to me as is the audience. I do plan

to translate the show into Spanish to try and garner a wider audience for it perhaps even in Mexico. I think that would be great fun!

Where would you like to see your career go within the next 5 to 10 years?

That's always a difficult question because almost any answer one gives makes them sound pretentious – unless they answer something like, "oh in 5 to 10 years my career will be down the gutter!"

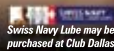

William Umana
"Beats"

His Way to the DJ Booth

*The veteran Dallas producer
prepares to take U.S. dance floors by storm.*



House music runs in William Umana's blood. It's been a part of who he is for over 20 years, and after fueling the sets of some of the most esteemed DJs in the dance music scene with blistering original tracks such as "Declaration" and his Star 69 Records release "Tribal Evolution" Umana is ready to jump headlong into DJ booths throughout the United States.

"When I'm not creating music, I'm thinking about creating it," the Colombia native laughs. "Music is in the air everywhere—no matter where I am or what I'm doing, there's always a tune in my mind."

Music doesn't stay trapped in Umana's head long. The veteran producer has a formidable track record when it comes to delivering fiery cuts to some of the biggest disc jocks in the dance scene today. His

biting productions with artists like Alan T., Jeanie Tracy, Viola Wilts and Ceevox to bangin' barnstorming remixes on tunes such as "Brinca" and "Party People" caught the ears of spinning superstars Tracy Young, Peter Rauhofer and Ralph Rosario in short order.

"Ralph Rosario has always been one of my DJ idols," Umana shares. "When I finally got the chance to meet him personally, he said, 'William, I've been playing your track 'Declaration' for such a long time! Can you please give me the a cappellas so I can do my own remix?' It was unbelievable! It still amazes me to think that one of the producers and DJs I admired for so long wanted to remix one of my songs."

Rosario wasn't alone in his admiration of the aspiring talent. "My second record 'Fly to the Clouds' grabbed the attention of some big names and before I knew it I was being asked if my track could be used on the Centaur RecordsTKTK Black & Blue compilation," Umana recalls, still somewhat in disbelief about his meteoric rise.

"After that Peter Rauhofer included me on his Live at Roxy compilation, which was all remixes except for two original artists—me and Madonna." The accolades and international dance floor success Umana is enjoying at present marks the culmination of an unyielding dedication to dance music that began during Umana's youth in Colombia. "I was in my teens when my sister told me to listen to a new radio station in town that was broadcasting this cool, new sound," Umana reminisces. "Once I heard it, I never looked back."

That "cool, new sound" was disco, and from that point on Umana's prime passion was to create and play music for crowds that appreciated that same type of music. It wasn't long before Umana found himself in Italy, learning the intricacies of production from award-winning studioman Mario Perron.

"I have a very specific approach to the way I create music," Umana explains. "I concentrate initially on laying down meticulous drum programming. Only after I've got the drums perfect will I even attempt to add keyboards or samples. If you don't have a solid beat, you won't have a solid track!"

One can easily see the same technique at work when Umana steps into the DJ booth. "Tribal drums are at the core of my sound," the DJ explains. "My music also has a bit of a Latin flavor—no doubt due to my heritage and the way my sound grew as I was playing gigs in Brazil, Colombia and Mexico as I honed my DJ skills—but the common denominator is always hot basslines and driving beats. I don't care who you are or where I'm playing—if you're on my dance floor, you will be moving!"

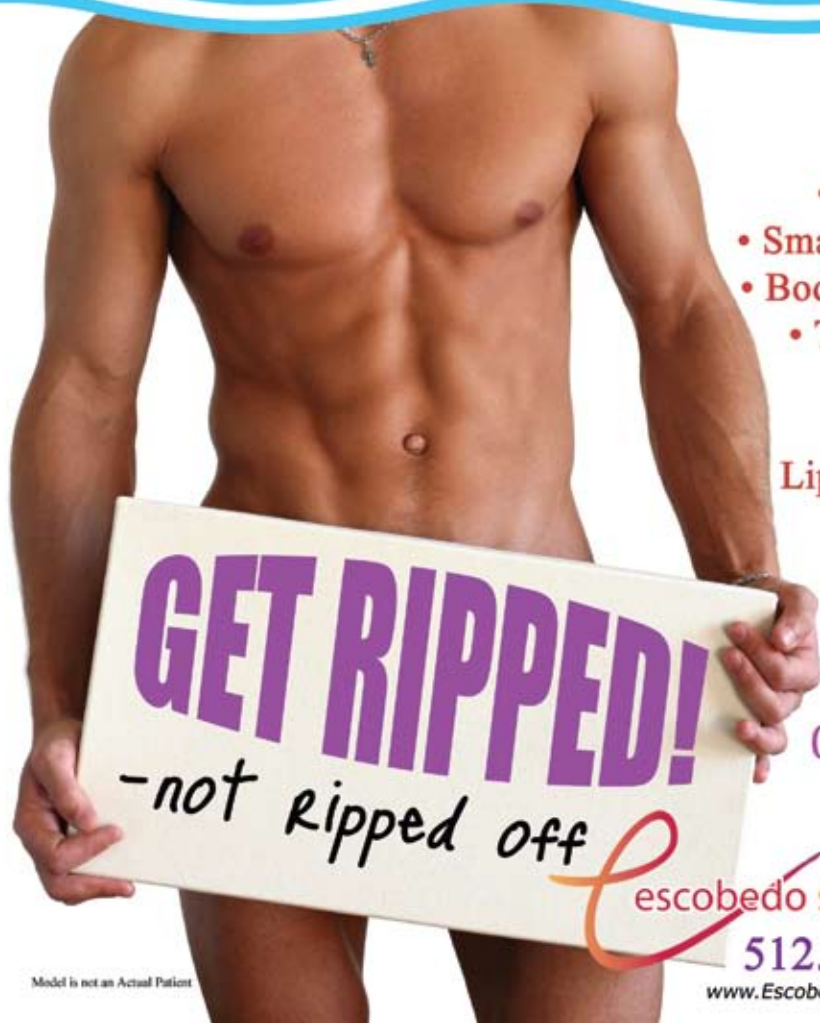

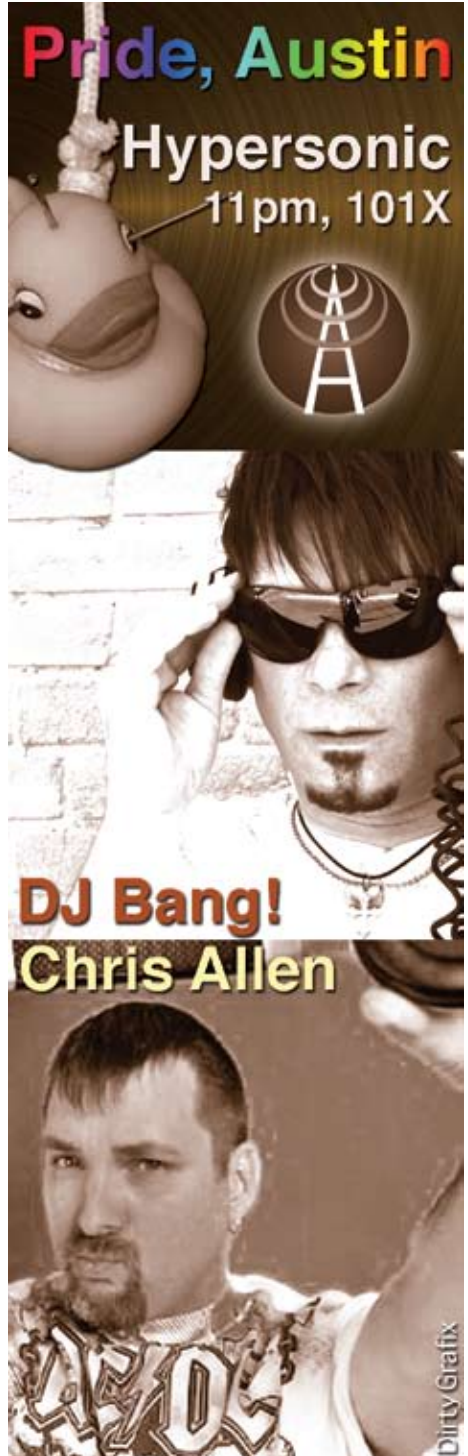
