GROOVELINES

Howdy disco citizens! It's time for your weekly dose of Groovelines – your source for what's hot and hip in the land of electronic dance music and beyond.



Over at iTunes, and hot for digital download, is the amazing and extensive catalog from the former king of pop, the late Michael Jackson. As you all know, Michael Jackson died last Thursday afternoon in LA. Sad news. It was a very bad week for white celebrities. First Ed McMann, then Farrah, and finally MJ. If you didn't know Michael Jackson had died – I am very sorry to be the bearer of bad news – now go crawl back under your rock.

As a member of the music biz and a long time DJ, I gotta say – that man was an amazing talent. Michael Jackson's music moved us. Very often, to the dance floor. Even before the days of digital editing MJ was releasing 12 inch singles with extended or edited versions of his songs. Before that, some were written just for the dance floor. Like "Don't Stop 'Til You Get Enough" or "Wanna Be Starting Something" – both clocking in at over 6 minutes long. As the 80's passed and the 90's came about and computers came into play, the remixers and producers took Michael Jackson's brilliant song writing and vision to an even higher level. Some of the best house I have ever heard had his vocals on top of it. I still have an entire crate of Michael Jackson dance records from back in the day. As a DJ, I have been playing his songs throughout my entire career. And even before then, I was fan. Diggin' the dude's funky grooves. Jealous of those stellar moves. I still remember buying *Thriller* on vinyl at the mall when it was released, when I was a kid. MJ had his stuff reworked by some of the best remixers to ever produce dance music on this planet. The short list includes Todd Terry, Frankie Knuckles, Moby, Paul Oakenfold, Hani, Tony Moran, Ben Liebrand, Civilles & Cole, Steve "Silk" Hurley,





David Morales, Kenny Dope, DJ Bobo, E-Smoove, Basement Boys, Roger Sanchez, Jungle Brothers, Love To Infinity, Junior Vasquez, and even Pete Heller. To name a few. Several of these can be heard on the MJ compilation *Blood On The Dance Floor / History In The Mix* that was released in 1997. I was really looking forward to Michael Jackson's new material. Anxious to hear his voice again on the dance floor, singing new stuff. Looking forward to finding out what remixers were chosen for the singles and grooving to their interpretations. Curious to know, would this grant Michael Jackson a comeback? Well, it seems like maybe Karma or Mother Nature had other plans for MJ. So, let's raise a glass of Jesus Juice in Michael Jackson's memory and, for a moment, remember him as the great performer that he was. God speed MJ, thanks for the tunes. Now stay away from my nephews you freaky ghost!

Deep in the heart of Texas, that is the Groovelines for now. You know the golden rule boys and girls - play it loud and disturb the neighbors!

Remember, life might not always be the party you had hoped for, but while you're here you might as well dance.

Quite a compliment from the source for circuit parties and gay events around the world, yet so richly-deserved. He has also had the pleasure of learning from some of his musical inspirations - inspirations that include DJ Trypsin, Roland Belmares, Peter Rauhofer, and Manny Lehman.

Within 3 years of moving to Austin, Seth headlined at Suede Lounge (San Antonio), Oil Can Harry's (Austin), Octo-Tea 12 and 13 (Austin), Tin Room (Dallas), Excuses/Club One (Dallas), Guava Lamp (Houston), Meteor (Houston), and at various Equality Texas and Human Rights Campaign fund raisers. He also was on the lineup for Surge (Tampa Bay), Gay Days (Orlando), and the kick-off party for Jungle 15 & 16 (Houston).

Then, in August of 2008, Seth headlined his first major party over Labor Day Weekend: Splash Days After Hours' Adult Swim party. The energetic, powerful, and fresh sound that Seth delivered proved that he could DJ a venue-packed, high-profile party. From this performance alone, Just Circuit labeled Seth as one of the next great DJ's to come out of Austin on the heels of Roland Belmares and Michael Tank (other well-known Austinites). Throughout 2008, Seth toured through Austin, Houston, Dallas, San Antonio, Orlando, and Tampa and to end the year, traveled to the opposite side of the country to debut in Seattle at Cuff Complex, delivering a spectacular, surprising, and energetic performance to the masses that were skeptical of an untested DJ; the party ended at 4am with a packed dance floor applauding!

On March 1st, Just Circuit announced Seth Cooper as the winner for the "Best Up and Coming DJ" category and what proves to be Seth's most accomplished moment to date! Seth was also nominated in 2009 as "Best DJ in Austin" by the Austin Chronicle!

Tomorrow night, July 4, the dashing and debonair Cooper returns to Dallas to spin for SIN Parties' "Freedom" at Excuses (Club One.) SIN Parties has, in the relatively short time counted by the circuit scene, become a major Metroplex powerhouse for the hosting and promotion of circuit events, and counts the Purple Party and Splash Days Austin as significant partners and supporters. Their events are always well-attended and expertly-run, and the addition of Seth Cooper to its roster of DJ's bodes well for the future of both.

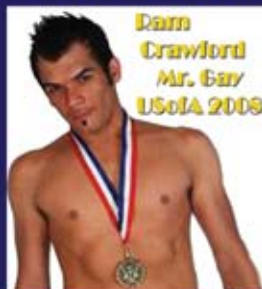

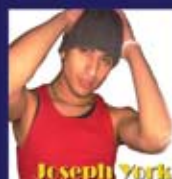

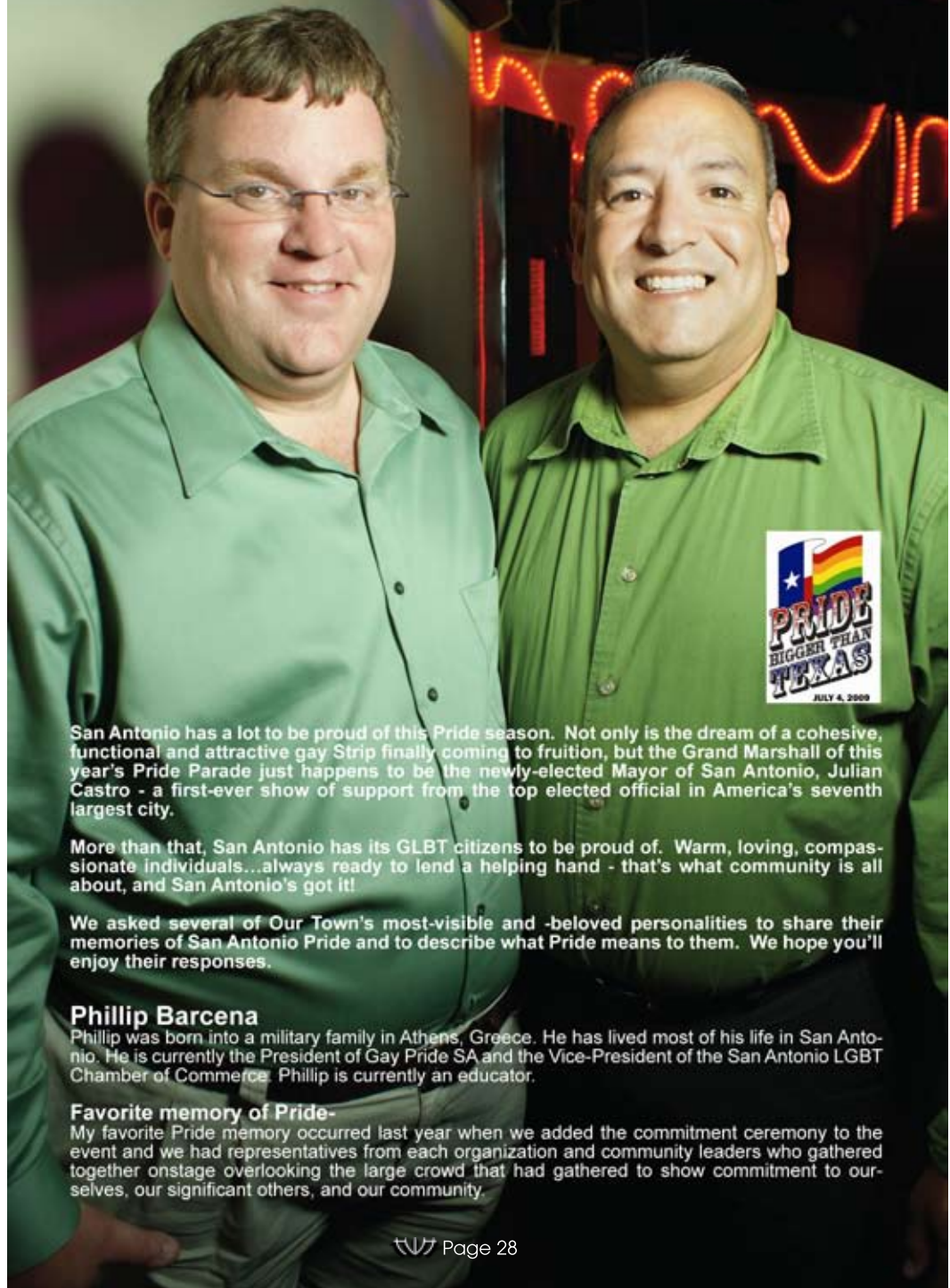

MEMORIES OF PRIDE



San Antonio has a lot to be proud of this Pride season. Not only is the dream of a cohesive, functional and attractive gay Strip finally coming to fruition, but the Grand Marshall of this year's Pride Parade just happens to be the newly-elected Mayor of San Antonio, Julian Castro - a first-ever show of support from the top elected official in America's seventh largest city.

More than that, San Antonio has its GLBT citizens to be proud of. Warm, loving, compassionate individuals...always ready to lend a helping hand - that's what community is all about, and San Antonio's got it!

We asked several of Our Town's most-visible and -beloved personalities to share their memories of San Antonio Pride and to describe what Pride means to them. We hope you'll enjoy their responses.

Phillip Barcena

Phillip was born into a military family in Athens, Greece. He has lived most of his life in San Antonio. He is currently the President of Gay Pride SA and the Vice-President of the San Antonio LGBT Chamber of Commerce. Phillip is currently an educator.

Favorite memory of Pride-

My favorite Pride memory occurred last year when we added the commitment ceremony to the event and we had representatives from each organization and community leaders who gathered together onstage overlooking the large crowd that had gathered to show commitment to ourselves, our significant others, and our community.

Pride means to me...

The gathering of our community and families to celebrate our lives. People often use the word lifestyle. But Pride is a celebration of our lives not lifestyles.

James Poindexter

James is a native San Antonian and is an educator.

Favorite Pride Memory-

My favorite memory of Pride is from this year actually. After the mayor accepted our invitation to be Grand Marshal, there was a bit of a political backlash from inside and outside the Gay community. Some people from certain segments of the straight community claimed that he put the City of San Antonio on shaky moral ground by supporting an "immoral" segment of San Antonio society. Some people in the Gay community criticized us for not recognizing someone from our community and for recognizing someone that we did not know yet was truly going to be fighting for us. But this mayor decided to become the first mayor in San Antonio to actually participate in the Pride parade, much less be Grand Marshal. This is historic. And he announced that decision six days after taking office! And when questioned by the media his response was, "San Antonio is a place for EVERYONE!" I think the mayor was a good choice-a very good choice.

What does Pride mean to me?

To me Pride is a celebration of our lives. It is about our community joining together to celebrate our shared identities. We may be from different socio-economic backgrounds, different ethnicities, different political or religious motivations but together we share an identity of an oppressed class of people that still are marginalized not by what we are but by WHO we are. To me Pride is about celebrating diversity and unity. Our mentors, Zip and Lady Barbara from Houston, passed on to us something that had become their trademark and their code by which they live-Unity in the Community. Gay Pride SA was established to "facilitate the needs of the individual so that the individual can facilitate the needs of the community". This is our motto. When planning a Gay Pride SA event, this is the motto that we keep in the back of our minds. One of my favorite quotes comes from the late lesbian activist and poet Audre Lorde. She said, "It is not our differences but rather our inability to recognize, accept, and celebrate those differences that divides us." So, for me, we still have people losing their jobs because of who they are. We still have people being discriminated against in housing decisions, custody decisions, and people being kicked out of the military because of a shared identity with an oppressed group. We must remain visible. We must remain vigilant in our fight. Pride lets us do that. Pride lets us tell the world, "This is who we are. We are not going away. We are part of your city. We are your neighbors, we are your school board members, we are your teachers, we are your doctors, your lawyers, your gardeners, and the parents of your child's best friend." Pride, to me is about creating Unity in the Community by facilitating the needs of the individuals of our community through recognizing, accepting, and celebrating differences and thereby facilitating the needs of our collective community that is bound by a shared identity.

James and Phillip celebrate 19 years together during Pride month 2009. Together they have survived the trials and tribulations of most married couples. A chance meeting at the Bonham Exchange led to a long relationship that has survived the test of time. Phillip and James are both members of various organizations including Gay Pride SA, the Stonewall Democrats, the Human Rights Campaign, Equality Texas, and the Royal, Sovereign, and Imperial Court of the Alamo Empire.

DJ Lydia Prim turns up the Heat!



LYDIA

Billboard reporting DJ (since Oct'94), Lydia Prim, may be the buzzword on every gay circuit boy's lips these days. But she's certainly no newcomer to the turntables. Born in Montgomery, Alabama, she's been playing in the Southern club scene since 1989 when she began her first residency at Pensacola's Office. She quickly earned a loyal Southern fan base between such cities as Birmingham, New Orleans, and Atlanta, playing regional venues like Oz, Backstreet, the Station, and the Bourbon Pub. In May of 1994, Lydia played the main event, Big Top, at Pensacola's Memorial Day Weekend, which began a series of fairly important dance events that included: Chicago's Hearts, Miami's Amnesia, New Orleans' Decadance, and various Hotlanta parties. However, it wasn't until 1999's Folsom Street Festival in San Francisco that Lydia finally earned high accolades on a national level, for her performance at the closing party.

"[I] staunchly refuse to believe that the nation of party boys and girls want to travel to various events all over the U.S. just to hear the same songs played by different DJs,"

She has since become one of the most-liked and talked about DJs in the country... not merely because she's a female in a male-dominated industry, but because she is an incredible artist with, what seems to be, a direct connection to the dance floor. Lydia's style is definitely all her own; incorporating a soulful blend of tribal beats, progressive trance, and the perfectly-timed anthemic vocals...all with a distinctive butch edge. Playing nearly all on vinyl, her mixes are smooth, seamless, and intoxicating...her playful nature and sharp humor always evident in her spinning.

Raf Katigbak of Montreal's Mirror magazine sat down with Lydia Prim to discuss her style, her popularity and whether anyone on Earth will ever catch her in an A-line dress:

"From a distance, with her cap pulled down, it's easy to mistake Alabama-born DJ Lydia Prim for a good ol' boy instead of a Southern belle - a fact that suits her just fine. For the last 15 years, Prim has been repping the hot and sticky Southern club circuit in a major way. As one of the 150 DJs around the country who 'report' a weekly chart to Billboard for the Hot 100 Dance chart, her mix of tribal beats, anthemic vocals and progressive trance have resulted in residencies in NYC's Twilo, Miami's Salvation and Cincinnati club the Dock, and bookings in every major circuit party in North America - including, of course, the Black & Blue Recovery party this coming Monday. The Mirror quizzed Prim about the Southern gay scene and what she would look like in a skirt.



Raf Katigbak: Aside from New Orleans, I never really hear much about the gay South. How would you characterize the scene in places like Alabama?

Lydia Prim: I am always amazed at what seems to be a somewhat dated and moronic view of us Southerners. People seem to think all of Alabama is hayseed-chewing rednecks and dirt roads. I think the gay community in the South experienced, in the '90s, a bit of their own civil-rights movement. That decade was to us what the '60s were to people of color. We have an annual dance event, Rights of Spring, which raises thousands for the local AIDS organizations, and we have a big Pride celebration in June. If you're looking for a scene outta Deliverance, then you're gonna be disappointed.



RK: When I asked DJ Manny Lehman if he could Queer Eye any DJ in the world, he jokingly said he would choose you. That is, put you in a skirt, put some highlights in your hair and get you to stop smoking - all from love, of course. Would you ever be up for that?

LP: Manny also said I was the only DJ he'd bottom for, so I think I'll pass on the skirt-makeover deal. Really, I should never be caught in a skirt. It's like watching a hockey player try to pull off a sundress or something."

Lydia Prim makes an exclusive San Antonio Pride appearance tomorrow night, July 4, at Heat, where she'll be spinning until the wee hours of Sunday morning. And you can always keep in touch with her - she just adores fans, ya know? - by visiting her on MySpace at myspace.com/Lydia.prim.

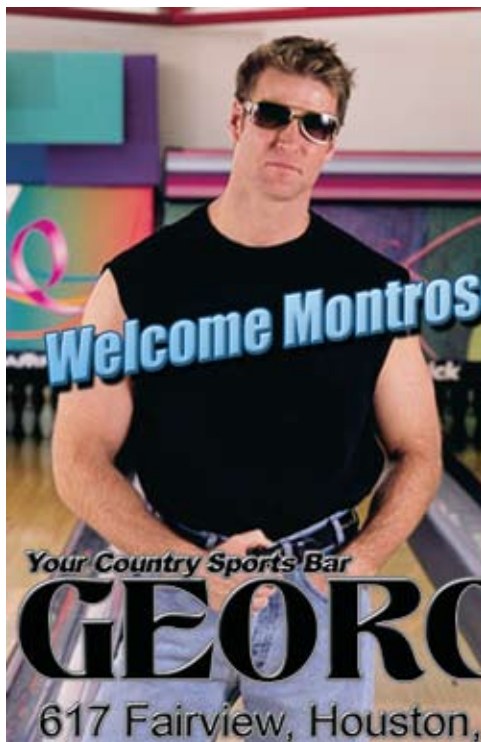

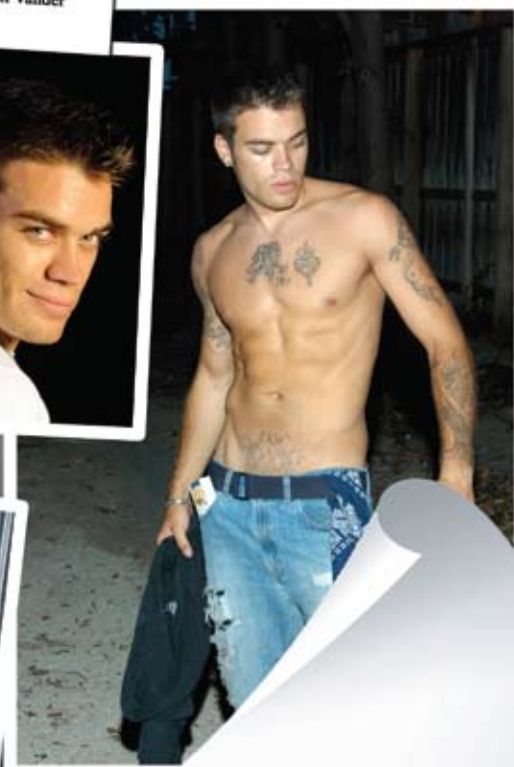
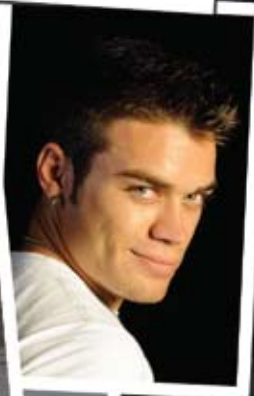
