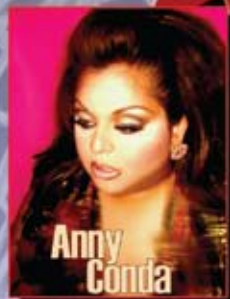

With Pride festivities now on-hold until Dallas presents their ginormous 2009 Alan Ross Texas Freedom Parade on September 20, we can direct our content to other significant pop culture items of interest to each and every one of you. Items such as the Chris Allen interview of songbird, snappy dresser and all-around GLBT supporter Kristine W, who started life last century as a Miss Washington of 1981 that went on to earn a scholarship and the honor of being a preliminary swimsuit winner in the 1982 Miss America pageant. And for the one or two of you that aren't sure, that's the real girl Miss America pageant, not the one they have in Memphis or St. Louis every year. 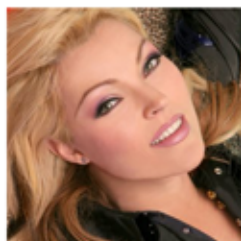

GROOVELINES

Howdy disco citizens! It's time for your weekly dose of Groovelines – your source for what's hot and hip in the land of electronic dance music and beyond.

Recent events and acts of total ignorance and rudeness have prompted me to publish this list of rules in regards to proper nightclub etiquette. Back in the 90's there was a similar version. It was posted on many a DJ booth door the world over, mine included. This updated version was passed on to me by fellow H-town DJ Neil Fogo. I feel it more appropriately addresses common problems we DJs encounter while trying to entertain you all in this day and age. School is in session! And there will be a quiz on this later so wake up and pay attention bitchez.

"HOW TO TALK TO A CLUB D.J.

If you're going to talk to the club D.J., DON'T SAY...

1. "Play something good... something we can dance to!" The D.J. has to play for more than one person, so what you may hate may be another's favorite song and everything played here can be danced to one way or another.
2. "Would you play something with a beat?" Don't be an idiot. We know of no songs played in a club that don't have some sort of a beat.
3. "I don't know who sings it and I don't know the name of the song, but it goes like this... la dee-dah-dee!" Please, don't sing for the DJ. They have to put up with smoke-filled rooms and dangerous decibel levels all night. 4. "Everybody wants to hear it!" Oh sure, you polled everyone in the club and, as their spokesperson, you are requesting the song. Also, do not make a request, then send all your friends to make the same request when the DJ doesn't play it. We're on to you bastards.
5. "I can get laid if you play it!" If you are good enough, you can get laid to anything!! (Also been known as "buy the album and get laid for a month!")
6. "I want to hear it next!" The only people who can get away with that statement write the DJ's pay-

check. Also a \$100 tip could help matters.

7. "I don't know what I wanna hear... what do you have?" It's a lot easier for you to go have another beer and figure out what you want to hear than it is for the DJ to recite the name of every record in the booth. * DJ C.A. adds - have been tempted to physically assault people for saying this *

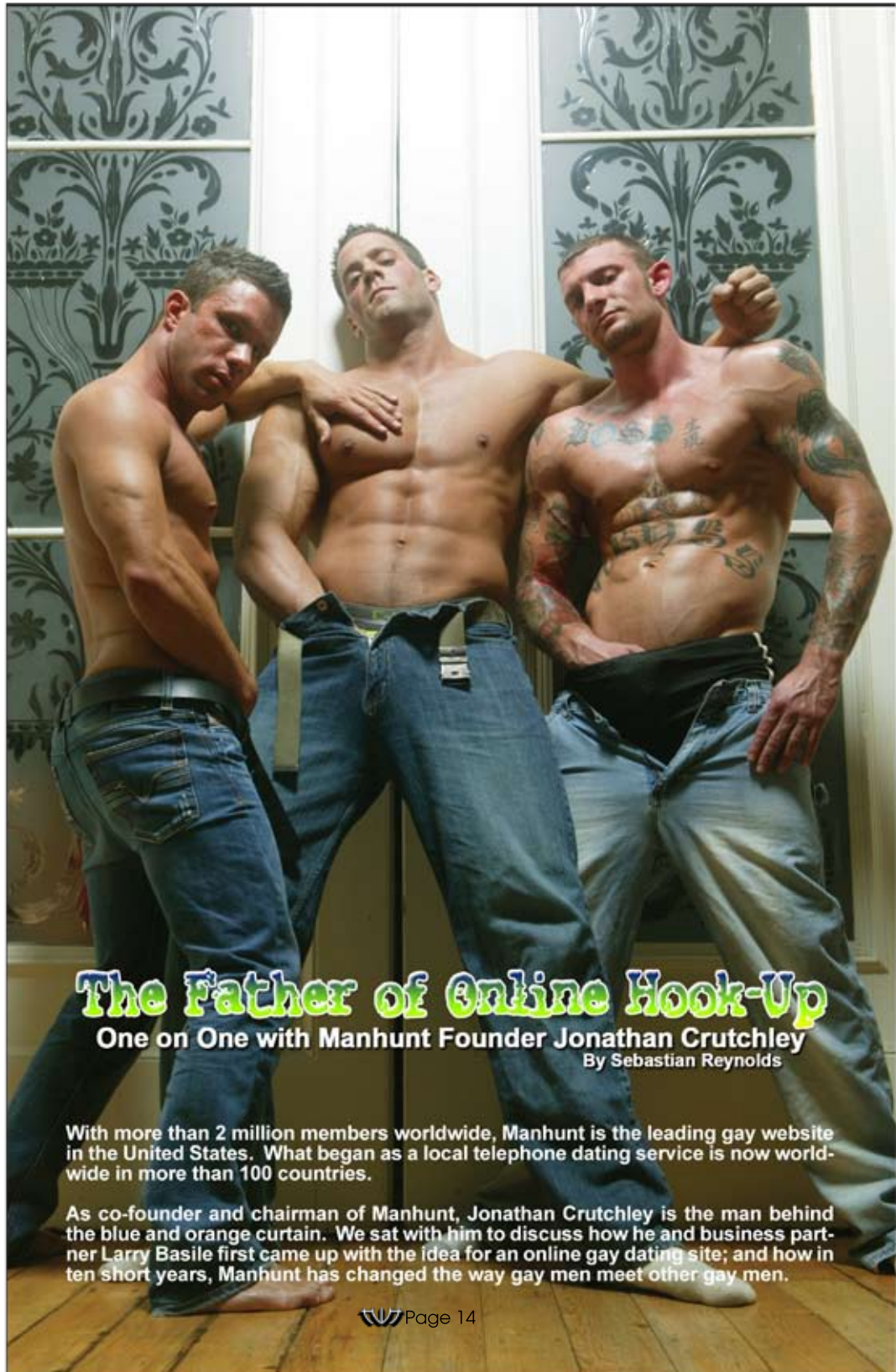

The Father of Online Hook-Up

One on One with Manhunt Founder Jonathan Crutchley

With more than 2 million members worldwide, Manhunt is the leading gay website in the United States. What began as a local telephone dating service is now worldwide in more than 100 countries.

As co-founder and chairman of Manhunt, Jonathan Crutchley is the man behind the blue and orange curtain. We sat with him to discuss how he and business partner Larry Basile first came up with the idea for an online gay dating site; and how in ten short years, Manhunt has changed the way gay men meet other gay men.

How has gay dating changed since the site began ten years ago? What were men looking for then? What are men looking for now?

Guys have always been looking for the same things. The internet makes it much easier to find exactly what you want.

Facebook toppled MySpace in 2009. With new competition entering the gay online dating industry every week, what is Manhunt doing to remain on top?

In the age of the internet, things change at internet speed. We always have to look over our shoulder to see who else is coming out with a different service that might catch on. Our biggest bet for continued growth is international expansion. There are more Manhunt subscribers outside the United States than within it. We are growing very rapidly in Brazil and all of Latin America, and we have expansion plans in Asia.

Do you pay attention to the competition?

Social networking sites like Bebo, MySpace, and Facebook have caught on very quickly, starting with teenagers and young people, and then becoming popular with an older demographic. Now you find grandmothers on Facebook. Manhunt serves all ages, but we have to

keep up with what 18 to early 20-somethings want in order to draw them into the group. I wouldn't rule out a partnership with a social networking site that appeals mainly to an under-30 demographic.

How does Manhunt feel about eHarmony and Match.com targeting the gay community?

Straight dating sites just don't get it as far as what gay men are looking for. Have you ever filled out one of their questionnaires that ask "do you want children" or "what is your income?" These are questions that women want to know about men as possible marriage partners. Gay men want to know what other men look like and how big it is.

Since the latest Craigslist murder in Boston, many have questioned the safety of meeting people on the internet. How safe is Manhunt?

I'm not supposed to say this, but meeting a stranger on Manhunt can be just as dangerous as meeting a stranger on Craigslist or in a bar or in a dark alley. We tell guys to be careful and meet first in a public place, but men will do what they want. The internet can be dangerous.

Is it Manhunt's responsibility to protect its

members from online predators?

We urge Manhunt members to take responsible precautions about meeting any stranger, but it is difficult if not impossible to prevent bad things from happening. If a criminal action does take place, such as a robbery or assault, local police can obtain information through a court-ordered subpoena or search warrant for information that may be in our data base that may help them prosecute.

Manhunt will be introducing its new version later this year. How will the new Manhunt be different than classic Manhunt?

Manhunt's new version is being rolled out as we speak in Australia and South America. Our current version is at capacity, so, when too many guys are on line at once, the site will crash. The new version accommodates many more users, but it will look different and take getting used to. Our Australian and Latin American users didn't like the new version at first because of the differences, but when they got used to it, and when we got all the bugs out of the system, everyone now seems fairly happy.

Is mobile the next big wave for meeting men?

Depends on what country you're in. In Japan cell phones outnumber computers, so you have to have a cell phone application and most people will use it. Mobile applications are taking longer to get adopted in the U. S., but they are catching on with young people first. Yes, the future is mobile. Manhunt has a mobile application and we're updating it.

How will men meet other men in 2020?

I'll send you a text message from Heaven and let you know.

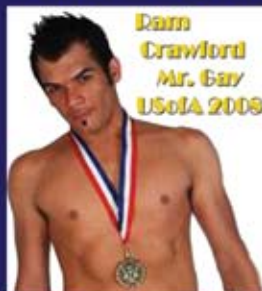

Kristine W has harnessed that power. She gets it. Over the past two decades, Kristine W has become a major player in the dance music industry. Performing to sold-out crowds time and time again, this stunningly beautiful chameleon is as visually-stimulating as she is vocally. Every new look she dons is candy for the eyes, every new song food for the soul. And she doesn't limit herself. Kristine W is just as happy and comfy singing her club hits as she is getting up close and personal with a touch of jazz and soul.

An accomplished musician, Kristine not only sings her heart out, but she also plays piano, guitar, and sax. Chris Allen: *The Power Of Music*. What a great title for an absolutely wonderful album. What was the inspiration behind this song in particular, and why did you choose that song to be the album's title track?

CA: You've included quite a variety of musical styles on *The Power Of Music*, from urban to pop to rock to dance – each showcasing your vocal talents flawlessly. Do you have a favorite?

KW: THANKS! I love the drama of "Not So Merry Go Round." It is very epic and honest. I am amazed we were able to create/produce a song that I believe is going to be timeless.

CA: How many of your older tracks were "updated" for the album, and why?

KW: "Feel What You Want" – It was my first big dance hit and so many people have remixed it. I wanted to have a version I could perform live that was updated and fresh and showcased not only the production originally done but combined the new technology of today – sounds and production have changed a lot in the last 10 years.

CA: This album was a long time in the making. Are you pleased with the final outcome?

KW: Surprisingly pleased – from working with different producers and writing songs at different times spread out over a few years and it all came together. When I listened to the actual CD for the first time it was a great feeling. It took a lot of work but it was worth it.



CA: How has the response been from your fans?

KW: They absolutely love it. I have received so many great emails and posts on my social network sites telling me a certain song sounds like their particular story. They can relate to [a certain] song and feel like the song is their own – talking to them, expressing how they feel. The message of the songs seems to really be in line with what people are feeling.

CA: Can your Texas fans expect a tour in promotion of *The Power Of Music*?

KW: I am definitely touring. The Power of Music 2009 Tour has started! I hope to make it Texas again soon. I love Texas – I have played Dallas and Houston several times, and I love it every time I get to go back. Love the great Mexican/Southwest food and Texas has amazing fans. It is all a matter of timing. All of the tour dates can be found at my website, www.kristinew.com. Dates are being added all of the time.

CA: Where can we hear and see more from you online? Do you Twitter, or are you on Facebook?

KW: Yes I Twitter and I have a Facebook page. I am on every social network site that makes sense to be on. It is the new way to market yourself and your music so you can't afford not to be. It is also a great communication tool with my fans.

CA: Where is the best place for your fans, new and old, to buy your full-length album, *The Power Of Music*?

KW: If you purchase them from my website, www.kristinew.com. I will autograph them. The physical CD will also be available in stores in the next week or so. For the digital download, that can be found on many internet sites, including iTunes and my website. The album actually debuted at #42 this week on the Billboard Electronic album charts and it debuted at #5 on the iTunes Dance album chart.

CA: What's next for Kristine W?

KW: I am touring almost every week and I am finishing up my next project – a jazz/chill album called "Straight Up With a Twist."

CA: In closing, what is one thing you would like people to know about yourself?

KW: There is always more than one thing – LOL. I love what I do and bringing joy through music to the world. I love performing live. I am a good Mom to my kids and I take care of my Mom. I also take care of any wayward animals that come my way.

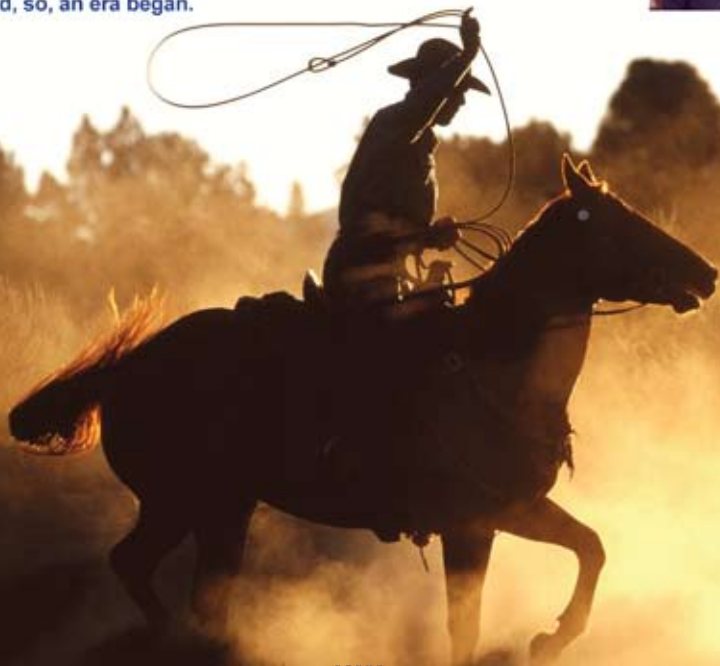
Silver Dollar Saloon

Many years ago - over a quarter century, actually - there was a little old business called the Peppermint Palace at 1418 North Main Avenue, in the heart of what is now quickly becoming the hub of San Antonio's GLBT entertainment district - the Strip, if you will. Famous for the peppermint-scented bubbles that wafted out into the parking lot every time a customer entered or left the establishment, it was - pure and simple - a men's topless bar. And, no, that didn't mean that there were male dancers; rather, it was the buxom broads that lured in a straight, male clientele. Considering the fact that the Sunset Boulevard (which is now the Saint, located just next door) was an adult movie theater, the presence of those bubbles was definitely appropriate - if not downright expected.

The mid-80's brought myriad changes to San Antonio's gay nightlife, as the renowned couple that owned the hugely-successful Copa in both Houston and Beaumont set their sights on the Alamo City. Not only did they buy the Sunset Boulevard from owners Steve Hutchison and Mark Comstock, they also managed to persuade the girls at the Palace to hang up their pasties and move to suburbia. In so doing, Lynn Ganey and Gene Howell created a gay entertainment megaplex anchored by the Copa on one end and a new, country-western venue - the Silver Dollar Saloon - at the other.



And, so, an era began.



Opened in October of 1985, Lynn and Gene continued to operate the Dollar for eight years, until both of them fell victim to illness and, in June, 1993. Lynn's relatives, Joe and Patricia Ganey, assumed ownership of the popular club. The pair became very successful with the venture, and truly loved both the business and their loyal customers, and appreciated the goodwill that was always extended to them by the GLBT community.

Through the years, the Dollar was an enormously-popular hangout for everyone in the community - including the token heterosexual that just wanted a cold longneck and a laid-back environment. Even though the bubbles might have disappeared with the Palace, the space at 1418 North Main Avenue continued to attract a legion of fans and appreciative customers through its doors and, for many, it was the only club they felt even remotely comfortable patronizing.



But, life and commerce both move inexorably forward and the Silver Dollar Saloon shuttered its doors to the public on Fathers Day, June 21st of this year after almost a quarter-century of providing Alamo City residents with a quality product in a calming atmosphere. But, no worries...

Because, next Friday, July 17th, the Silver Dollar officially grand opens its new, larger and infinitely more posh incarnation just three blocks away at 1814 North Main - the site of the X-ing nightclub, just next door to Hogwild Records and Tapes. With the club's new owner, Mike Ganey, the staff looks forward to serving the San Antonio community for the next 25 years - and, considering the new space, confidence remains high that they'll do so.

The new Silver Dollar features four full-service bars inside the huge 14,000 sq ft. complex, with three separate dance floors that will offer the best variety and quality of dance music in San Antonio. Except for special events, there will be no cover charge for the over 21crowd,



and - because of the size and variety of the décor in each of the club's massive rooms - you can park just once and party seven days a week - all in a completely different atmosphere. And, with a club occupancy capacity of 499 party-lovers, you can be sure that each time you visit will be just like the first, and that you'll always be experiencing new and different adventures each time you walk through the door.



According to comments made in a 210-SA interview, Paul Rubio, assistant manager of the Silver Dollar, stated that "the new location will cater to the 18-and-over crowd, and will be about two-and-a-half time larger (than its previous venue.) It will have a lounge area and a dance area."

"I don't like change myself," Rubio continued, "but I guess you need change for growth. All good things must come to an end, and the end of one era is the beginning of a new one."

A new era has begun in vanguard of that epoch.

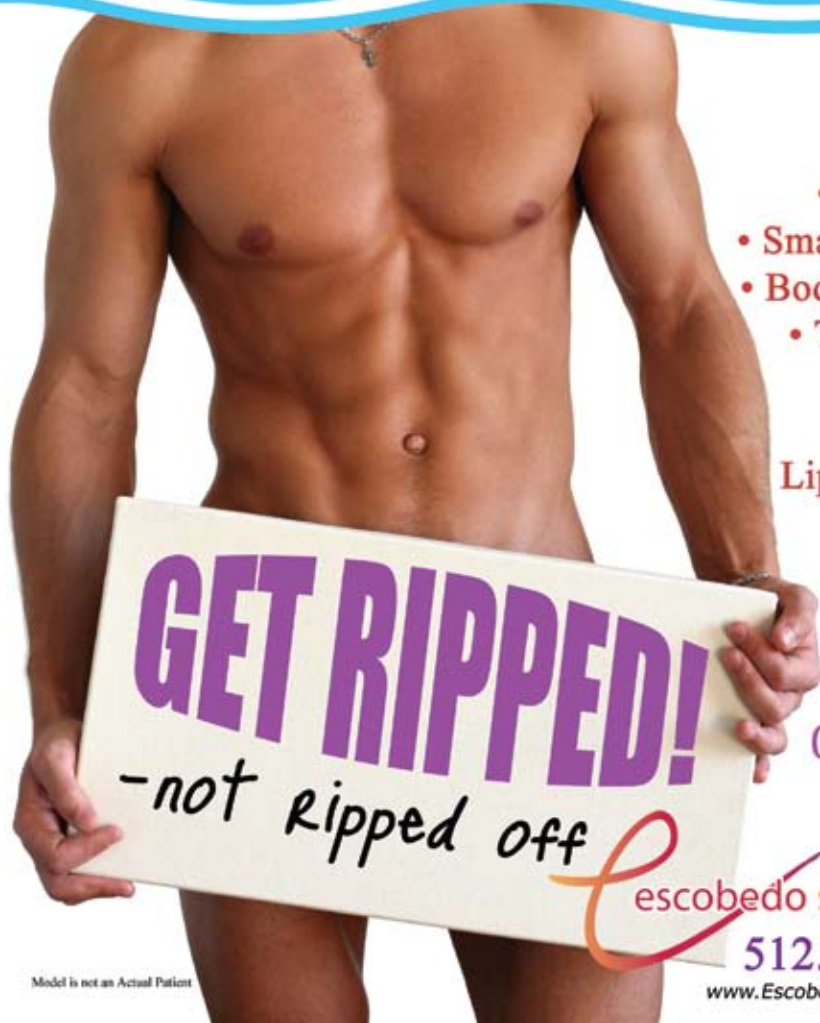
