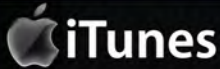

This release is an interesting turn for producers Manian and Yanou and it really showcases Natalie's versatility as a singer. I am really looking forward to the full length album that is due for release here in the states on August 18th. The video for *Evacuate The Dance Floor* is also available for purchase at iTunes, only a buck 99. The single on the other hand will cost ya a ten spot. 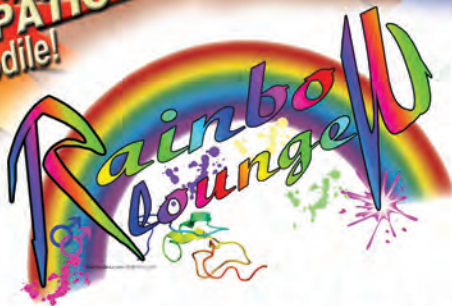

KING OF DISCO

Barton Releases Beach cd

“Disco is not dead,” declares Barton.

“I hear a lot of music on the radio today that is very clearly disco derivative, inspired by classics like ABBA’s “The Visitors”, Yello’s “Vicious Games” or Grace Jones’ “Feel Up”.”

The out singer aims to add a few of his own songs to the list of tracks that will endure on gay dance floors. Two of his singles have already become staples: the dark extended mix of “Take Me Up” (featured on the soundtrack of the film “Boy Culture”) and his ascendant dub of “To Call My Own”.

This summer, Barton will release his next full-length album, **LESSONS LEARNED**. The first single will be “On the Beach”, a song that artfully blends metaphors of nature with unforgettable lyrics. It’s a deep track; one that may not play on Top 40 radio but that’s ok with Barton.

“I am not and never intend to be a Madonna or a Depeche Mode” he says. “I’m incredibly lucky to be able to make music that I love. I will be known and appreciated well by some people – not all – and that is exactly right for me.”

What lessons have you learned as an openly gay artist?

You have to take the risk to truly be yourself in order to find what's worthwhile.

Is it still difficult for an out-artist to break into mainstream?

Gay or straight, there's a lot of competition for a musician. A friend who works for a major record label calls part of what he does for a living "pushing people through the looking glass". That's not what I wanted when I set out to do music. Doing things on my own terms is important for me.

How does the new album compare with your 2008 release, FORMATIVE?

Hearing the two albums next to each other is a little like watching a flower open up. The production values and vocal arrangements are far richer and more complex in the new album. Also, it was a more collaborative effort. I co-wrote many of the new songs with some exceptional artists. You start to hear with other people's ears when you work with other talent.

Who influences you as an artist?

Vocalists like Linda Ronstadt, David Sylvian, Annie Lennox and Neil Young are strong influences for me; also late 70s disco.



What was the inspiration behind your first single, ON THE BEACH?

I was in Provincetown, walking alone on the beach with the waves crashing and the sun beating down. I looked up and I noticed the moon was in the sky! It made me reflect on all the elements around me – the water, the sand, the sky, the sun and moon, and how they were all connected on the beach.

The first line is "on the beach I see you"... who are you referring to?

While soaking in the wonders around me, I started thinking about a man I loved, who I missed, and longed to be with. I imagined seeing him on the beach in front of me. The song is about being in love and how love can sometimes feel like drowning in an ocean.

What's your favorite track on the album?

The one that speaks to me the most "Nothing Lasts Forever". It's about how our lives are finite and the importance of capturing the beauty in each experience.

The notion of celebration seems to be a common theme in most of your songs. Why is celebration important to you?

That's due to the influence of late 70's disco, which was all about celebrating being yourself. Artists like Sylvester, who made music in San Francisco where LESSONS LEARNED was recorded, used his music to take people to a higher place. That is something I aspire to do in my music.

Does the gay community have reason to celebrate in 2009?

We certainly do. The gay community is finally uniting as a group to battle important civil rights issues.

What do you feel we need to pay more attention to in our fight for civil rights?

The passing of California's Proposition 8 has made it much clearer what we are facing in terms of discrimination. How we respond, how we live our lives, how we act in the world is what we need to pay attention to.

What do you say to those who want to label you as a dance artist?

I am a dance artist. I also make pop music. I don't mind labels, I think it is human to categorize things and label them. But there is always something behind the label, if you care to look.

Is there anything your fans might be surprised to learn about you?

I don't think so. I lay myself out pretty bare on my album.

What words do you live by?

Listen to your own voice.

SUPANOVA'S LITTLE SECRET

Supanova is an eccentric entertainer that believes music and dance have the power to heal the soul and inspire the heart. The artist first broke into the scene in 2006 with "New Horizon", a pounding and catchy club track that remains a dance floor fave today. It's been three years but finally the artist who is part Sylvester, part Grace Jones - and perhaps a dab of beloved Michael Jackson - is back and ready to reclaim the spotlight. "No Secrets" is an edgy euro-infused track about a lady who transforms into a sexual creature of the night. Once again, Supanova impresses with sharp lyrics and a fresh sound that will add an exciting new flavor to this summer's dance floors.

"No Secrets" is about a woman who transforms into a sexual creature of the night. Is the track autobiographical? How much of Supanova is in the story? What inspired the track?

"No Secrets" is actually a cover, originally done by an awesome Aussie rock band called 'The Angels'. I was inspired by the energy, grit and rawness of the story. Though not autobiographical, it is biographical in that there are strong themes that resonate for me. My connection to the story and what I channeled when we were recording, is that I am Amanda's (the songs heroine) narrator, voyeur and/or alter ego, if you will.

Do you keep secrets? Do tell.

(Whispers) Psssstt... Come here... (Laughs)... I'll never tell!

You have been called part Sylvester, part Grace Jones. How have these icons influenced you as an artist?

Wow - what a gift and blessing to even be acknowledged anywhere in the same space as those two divas. Sylvester's musical genius and vocal style, that stratospheric falsetto! What? Beyond Ovuh!

What is your favorite Sylvester memory?

Unfortunately, I never got to experience Sylvester live and in person - but I am VERY clear about the ground he broke and the trails he blazed. I can still remember, years ago, up late one night watching videos and here comes "Someone Like You". I remember being riveted because at the time I was studying dance and Debbie Allen is in this video with Sylvester.

I was thinking: is that a man? a woman? who? what? Even through all these questions something moved in my soul and I saw myself. Now I had heard the other classics, "You Make Me Feel..." and "Do You Wanna Funk" but this was loooooong before YouTube so there was not nearly as much access to get a visual to connect with what you were hearing. I was forever changed.

Did you ever meet Grace Jones?

I have been blessed to meet, see, perform live with and hang out with Mizz Jones. Her voice, that body, and the fashion! I just the other day watched a recent performance of Grace performing 'Slave to the Rhythm' in a black corset with her legs up to her neck - but wait- she was hula hooping as she sang the song. She kept it going for the entire song - hula hooping, mic in one hand and cymbals/gongs in other hand and singing! Please don't get me started on how amazing she sounded and how fierce she looked: outfit and body. I got up and ran to the gym.

Like Grace Jones, your tracks tend to be hauntingly dark but with a ray of hopeful light infused within.

Yes. I would say for my first two releases, 'New Horizon' and 'No Secrets', that is accurate. No matter what is going on in the world or my feelings about what is going on, I do hope that my music gives listeners a way to transcend whatever hardship or negativity or despair.

Has the new horizon that you predicted in your 2006 debut come to be?

I would not say that I was predicting a new horizon per se, but that every day there is a new horizon. The imagery is that right before the sun bursts forth through clouds, rises over the water or mountains or comes up over a building, there is a moment when the sky changes and the energy changes. The light has appeared and the darkness is dispelled. This moment to me is one of hope and change and the possibility of something positive.

How has the world changed since New Horizon was first released?

How much space do we have for this interview? In the last few months, we have elected the first African-American President into office. Welcome to a New Horizon! In the last weeks we have had an avalanche of loss: legends, icons, angels whatever moniker you choose - the new horizon is now new with the stars that have left the Earth plane to shine on us from heaven. May they rest.

Do you see a day when the gay community will enjoy equal rights?

Of course. I can close my eyes and see it right now. We must all continue to hold fast to the vision of what the world will look like when we all have equal rights; bringing about change peacefully, evolving consciousness positively, and moving humanity forward.

As a public figure, do you feel a responsibility to make your voice heard in the struggle?

For me, personally - yes definitely -- point me to platform, turn my mic up! Werq!

How has SupaNova evolved since you first entered the music scene three years ago?

Wow, so much has changed in the music business. I would definitely say that I have evolved as an artist trying out different sounds and styles of music, as well as being more active on the production and business side. I am blessed that the work I have done thus far is opening more and more doors.

Who is the man behind SupaNova? What lies beneath the make-up and wigs?

You are really going IN with these questions!! I am just naked before you!! HaHa! Nothing about the wigs and/or makeup is there to conceal I use them to enhance; a feeling, an energy, a character.

Is SupaNova as strong and fearless as he presents himself to be on his CD covers?

Strong and fearless - I will take that. Thank you!

What do you do when you're not on stage or in the studio? What do you enjoy doing in your spare time?

I'm sorry, I have to run and get my dictionary to look-up spare time? What is that? (Laughs) Kidding! But you know what I mean. There is always an e-mail to reply to, a text to write back, a face to book or a my to space. You feel me? And don't even start me twittering - hold on a sec - just got a text.....

What is next for SupaNova?

Writing more songs, collaborating on more songs, producing here and there and please stay tuned for my next single 'Body Shake' which will be hitting the floors sometime in August. Check out a preview @ www.d1music.biz PEACE LOVE and BODY SHAKE it!

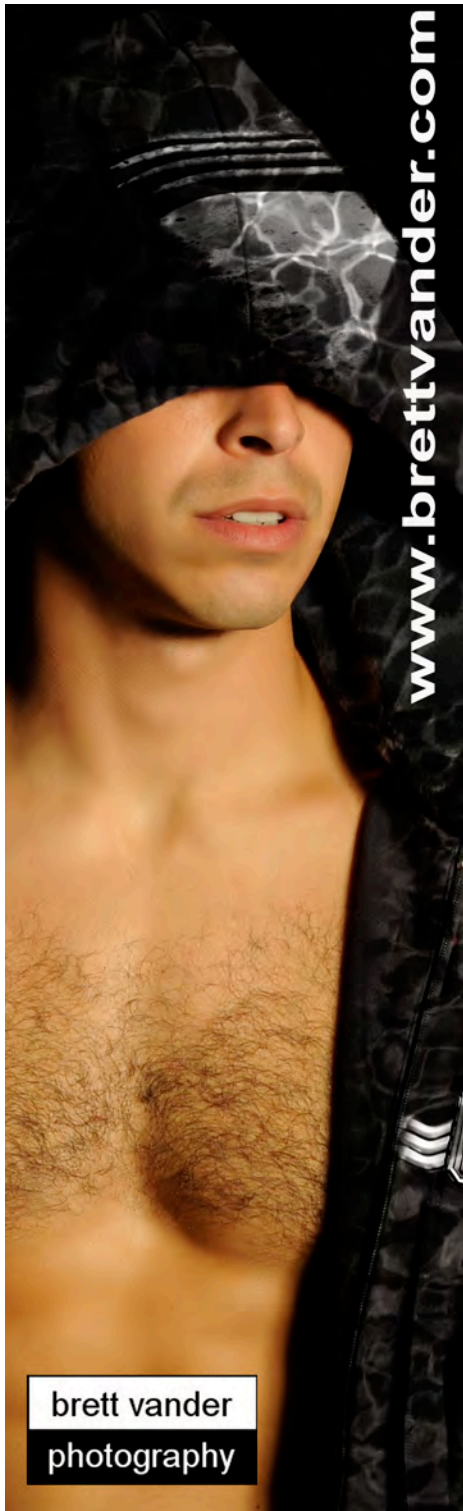
