The 26th Annual Alan Ross Texas Freedom Parade presented by The Dallas Tavern Guild is on Sunday, September 20 at 2pm. This year's theme is "YOUR RIGHTS, OUR RIGHTS, HUMAN RIGHTS". This year's Grand Marshalls are Dallas County Sherriff Lupe Valdez and Jesse Garcia of The Stonewall Democrats. The Honorary Grand Marshall is author, actor and AIDS activist Larry Kramer. Youth First Texas is this year's parade beneficiary.

The Parade stages are on Wycliffe Avenue between Maple Ave. and Cedar Springs Road. The Parade Route is down Cedar Springs Road from Wycliffe Avenue to Lee Park. Lee Park is located one block Northeast of Cedar Springs Road at the corner of Turtle Creek Blvd. and Hall Street.

The festival in Lee Park begins at noon. The featured speaker is Clive Jones, author and activist who founded the National Names Project AIDS Memorial Quilt and Co-Founder of the San Francisco AIDS Foundation. Featured entertainment is Anton Shaw and Her Band.

TWT asked people in the Dallas community to share their favorite Pride memories and explain what Pride means to them. The responses were diverse as our community and often fun but nonetheless personal and insightful.

There is a memory that I have that makes me very proud, on the 40th anniversary of
the Stonewall Rebellion in response to what happened in the Rainbow Lounge, right

after the Million Gay March, people went to Fort Worth from the march to protest and show how much they care about LGBT rights, not just in Dallas, but everywhere. I was really proud of the community as a whole for showing their outrage at the heinous crime and their support for the victims.

What does Pride mean to me?

Queer/LGBTQA Pride to me is something bittersweet. I see achievements worldwide that I'm very proud of, such as same-sex marriage being legal in Spain and that localed has a lesbian head of state, but I also see room for much improvement on the global scale. 
What does Pride mean to me?

Probably my first pride parade ever... I mean, where else can you see drag queens, dykes on bikes and leather daddles all in one place? Definitely something for everyone!


What does Pride mean to you?
